1-20 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-21 AN ACT

1-22 relating to the expiration of the dry cleaner environmental
1-23 response program.

1-24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-25 SECTION 1. Sections [374.253](#)(a), (b), and (c), Health and
1-26 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:

1-27 (a) This chapter expires on September 1, 2050 [~~2021~~].

1-28 (b) A corrective action, including any administrative
1-29 duties associated with the action, for which remediation of a
1-30 contaminated site has begun before September 1, 2050 [~~2021~~], shall
1-31 be completed in accordance with this chapter using money from the
1-32 fund, to the extent possible, but money may not be collected for or
1-33 added to the fund on or after that date.

1-34 (c) The commission may continue a corrective action that has
1-35 not progressed beyond the investigative or planning stage after
1-36 September 1, 2050 [~~2021~~], to the extent money from the fund is
1-37 available.

1-38 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
