BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 1-23 SECTION 1. Section 1951.003, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

1-24 Sec. 1951.003. BUSINESS OF STRUCTURAL PEST CONTROL. (a) Subsection (b) applies to [In this chapter, a person is engaged in the "business of structural pest control" if the person performs, 1-25 1-26 1-27 offers to perform, or advertises for or solicits the person's performance of any of the following services [for compensation, 1-28 including services performed as a part of the person's employment]: 1-29 1-30
