- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 79.039(a), Government Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (a) Each legal clinic or program in this state [that is
- 7 operated by a law school and] that receives financial support from
- 8 the commission shall submit to the commission an annual report
- 9 regarding criminal cases:
- 10 (1) in which the clinic or program has provided legal
- 11 services to an indigent defendant during the preceding calendar
- 12 year; and
- 13 (2) in which:
- 14 (A) based on a finding of actual innocence, the
- 15 court of criminal appeals overturns a conviction; or
- 16 (B) the governor issues a pardon based on actual
- 17 innocence.
- 18 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 79, Government Code, is
- 19 amended by adding Section 79.041 to read as follows:
- Sec. 79.041. INNOCENCE PROJECT GRANT PROGRAM. (a) Using
- 21 any funds available for the purpose, the commission may establish
- 22 an innocence project grant program to support:
- 23 (1) projects that screen, investigate, and litigate
- 24 post-conviction claims of actual innocence in non-capital cases in

- 1 this state; and
- 2 (2) associated expenses necessary to conduct those
- 3 activities.
- 4 (b) In making grant awards under the program, the commission
- 5 shall promote among projects coordinated strategies that will
- 6 enable those projects to efficiently screen requests for assistance
- 7 and to engage in effective investigation and litigation activities.
- 8 (c) Only a public or private law school in Texas is eligible
- 9 to receive grants under the program.
- 10 (d) A law school that receives a grant under Subsection (c)
- 11 may enter into a contract with a nonprofit organization that is
- 12 based in this state and operates an innocence project, provided
- 13 that the law school accepts primary responsibility for monitoring
- 14 the contract.
- 15 (e) The commission may adopt rules to implement this
- 16 section.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
