## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to workers' compensation death benefit eligibility for 1-19 1-20 certain spouses of first responders killed in the line of duty. 1-21

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 1-23 SECTION 1. Section 408.183(b-1), Labor Code, is amended to read as follows:

1-24 (b-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), an eligible spouse who remarried is eligible for death benefits for life if the 1-25 employee was a first responder, as defined by Section 504.055, who suffered death in the course and scope of employment or while providing services as a volunteer. This subsection applies 1-26 1-27 1-28 regardless of the date on which the death of the first responder 1-29 1-30 occurred.

SECTION 2. Section 2, Chapter 1018 (H.B. 1094), Acts of the 84th Legislature, Regular Session, 2015, is repealed. SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act to Section 1-31 1-32

1-33 408.183, Labor Code, applies only to an eligible spouse who remarries on or after the effective date of this Act. An eligible 1-34 1-35 spouse who remarried before that date is governed by the law as it existed immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the 1-36 1-37 1-38 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 1-39 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
