## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to the distribution, possession, purchase, consumption,
- 3 and receipt of cigarettes, e-cigarettes, and tobacco products;
- 4 providing penalties.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 161.081, Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Subdivision (1-b) to read as follows:
- 8 (1-b) "Minor" means a person under 21 years of age.
- 9 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 161.082, Health and
- 10 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 161.082. SALE OF CIGARETTES, E-CIGARETTES, OR TOBACCO
- 12 PRODUCTS TO PERSONS YOUNGER THAN 21 [18] YEARS OF AGE PROHIBITED;
- 13 PROOF OF AGE REQUIRED.
- SECTION 3. Sections 161.082(a) and (e), Health and Safety
- 15 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 16 (a) A person commits an offense if the person, with criminal
- 17 negligence:
- 18 (1) sells, gives, or causes to be sold or given a
- 19 cigarette, e-cigarette, or tobacco product to someone who is
- 20 younger than 21 = 18 years of age; or
- 21 (2) sells, gives, or causes to be sold or given a
- 22 cigarette, e-cigarette, or tobacco product to another person who
- 23 intends to deliver it to someone who is younger than 21  $[\frac{18}{18}]$  years
- 24 of age.

- (e) A proof of identification satisfies the requirements of Subsection (d) if it contains a physical description and photograph consistent with the person's appearance, purports to establish that the person is 21 [18] years of age or older, and was issued by a governmental agency. The proof of identification may include a driver's license issued by this state or another state, a passport,
- 7 or an identification card issued by a state or the federal
- 8 government.
- 9 SECTION 4. Section 161.084(b), Health and Safety Code, is 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (b) The sign must include the statement:
- 12 PURCHASING OR ATTEMPTING TO PURCHASE E-CIGARETTES OR TOBACCO
- 13 PRODUCTS BY A MINOR UNDER 21 [18] YEARS OF AGE IS PROHIBITED BY LAW.
- 14 SALE OR PROVISION OF E-CIGARETTES OR TOBACCO PRODUCTS TO A MINOR
- 15 UNDER 21 [18] YEARS OF AGE IS PROHIBITED BY LAW. UPON CONVICTION, A
- 16 CLASS C MISDEMEANOR, INCLUDING A FINE OF UP TO \$500, MAY BE IMPOSED.
- 17 VIOLATIONS MAY BE REPORTED TO THE TEXAS COMPTROLLER'S OFFICE BY
- 18 CALLING (insert toll-free telephone number). PREGNANT WOMEN SHOULD
- 19 NOT SMOKE. SMOKERS ARE MORE LIKELY TO HAVE BABIES WHO ARE BORN
- 20 PREMATURE OR WITH LOW BIRTH WEIGHT.
- SECTION 5. Sections 161.085(a) and (b), Health and Safety
- 22 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) Each retailer shall notify each individual employed by
- 24 that retailer who is to be engaged in retail sales of cigarettes,
- 25 e-cigarettes, or tobacco products that state law:
- 26 (1) prohibits the sale or distribution of cigarettes,
- 27 e-cigarettes, or tobacco products to any person who is younger than

- 1  $\underline{21}$  [ $\underline{18}$ ] years of age as provided by Section 161.082 and that a
- 2 violation of that section is a Class C misdemeanor; and
- 3 (2) requires each person who sells cigarettes,
- 4 e-cigarettes, or tobacco products at retail or by vending machine
- 5 to post a warning notice as provided by Section 161.084, requires
- 6 each employee to ensure that the appropriate sign is always
- 7 properly displayed while that employee is exercising the employee's
- 8 duties, and provides that a violation of Section 161.084 is a Class
- 9 C misdemeanor.
- 10 (b) The notice required by this section [Subsection (a)]
- 11 must be provided within 72 hours of the date an individual begins to
- 12 engage in retail sales of <u>cigarettes</u>, e-cigarettes, or tobacco
- 13 products. The individual shall signify that the individual has
- 14 received the notice required by this section [Subsection (a)] by
- 15 signing a form stating that the law has been fully explained, that
- 16 the individual understands the law, and that the individual, as a
- 17 condition of employment, agrees to comply with the law.
- SECTION 6. Section 161.086(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 (b) Subsection (a) does not apply to:
- 21 (1) a facility or business that is not open to persons
- 22 younger than 21 [18] years of age at any time;
- 23 (2) that part of a facility or business that is a
- 24 humidor or other enclosure designed to store cigars in a
- 25 climate-controlled environment; or
- 26 (3) a premises for which a person holds a package store
- 27 permit issued under the Alcoholic Beverage Code.

- 1 SECTION 7. Sections 161.087(a) and (b), Health and Safety
- 2 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 3 (a) A person may not distribute to persons younger than 21
- 4  $\left[\frac{18}{18}\right]$  years of age:
- 5 (1) a free sample of a cigarette, e-cigarette, or
- 6 tobacco product; or
- 7 (2) a coupon or other item that the recipient may use
- 8 to receive a free or discounted cigarette, e-cigarette, or tobacco
- 9 product or a sample cigarette, e-cigarette, or tobacco product.
- 10 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a person,
- 11 including a permit holder, may not accept or redeem, offer to accept
- 12 or redeem, or hire a person to accept or redeem a coupon or other
- 13 item that the recipient may use to receive a free or discounted
- 14 cigarette, e-cigarette, or tobacco product or a sample cigarette,
- 15 e-cigarette, or tobacco product if the recipient is younger than 21
- 16 [18] years of age. A coupon or other item that such a recipient may
- 17 use to receive a free or discounted cigarette, e-cigarette, or
- 18 tobacco product or a sample cigarette, e-cigarette, or tobacco
- 19 product may not be redeemable through mail or courier delivery.
- SECTION 8. Sections 161.088(b) and (d), Health and Safety
- 21 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 22 (b) The comptroller may make block grants to counties and
- 23 municipalities to be used by local law enforcement agencies to
- 24 enforce this subchapter and Subchapter R in a manner that can
- 25 reasonably be expected to reduce the extent to which cigarettes,
- 26 e-cigarettes, and tobacco products are sold or distributed,
- 27 including by delivery sale, to persons who are younger than 21 [18]

- 1 years of age. At least annually, random unannounced inspections
- 2 shall be conducted at various locations where cigarettes,
- 3 e-cigarettes, and tobacco products are sold or distributed,
- 4 including by delivery sale, to ensure compliance with this
- 5 subchapter and Subchapter R. The comptroller shall rely, to the
- 6 fullest extent possible, on local law enforcement agencies to
- 7 enforce this subchapter and Subchapter R.
- 8 (d) The use of a person younger than 21 [18] years of age to
- 9 act as a minor decoy to test compliance with this subchapter and
- 10 Subchapter R shall be conducted in a fashion that promotes
- 11 fairness. A person may be enlisted by the comptroller or a local
- 12 law enforcement agency to act as a minor decoy only if the following
- 13 requirements are met:
- 14 (1) written parental consent is obtained for the use
- 15 of a person younger than 18 years of age to act as a minor decoy to
- 16 test compliance with this subchapter and Subchapter R;
- 17 (2) at the time of the inspection, order, or delivery,
- 18 the minor decoy is younger than 20 [17] years of age;
- 19 (3) the minor decoy has an appearance that would cause
- 20 a reasonably prudent seller of cigarettes, e-cigarettes, or tobacco
- 21 products to request identification and proof of age;
- 22 (4) the minor decoy carries either the minor's own
- 23 identification showing the minor's correct date of birth or carries
- 24 no identification, and a minor decoy who carries identification
- 25 presents it on request to any seller of or any person who delivers
- 26 cigarettes, e-cigarettes, or tobacco products; and
- 27 (5) the minor decoy answers truthfully any questions

- 1 about the minor's age at the time of the inspection, order, or
- 2 delivery.
- 3 SECTION 9. Section 161.251, Health and Safety Code, is
- 4 amended by adding Subdivision (1-b) to read as follows:
- 5 "Minor" means a person under 21 years of age.
- 6 SECTION 10. Sections 161.252(a), (b), and (c), Health and
- 7 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) An individual who is younger than 21 [18] years of age
- 9 commits an offense if the individual:
- 10 (1) possesses, purchases, consumes, or accepts a
- 11 cigarette, e-cigarette, or tobacco product; or
- 12 (2) falsely represents himself or herself to be 21
- 13 [18] years of age or older by displaying proof of age that is false,
- 14 fraudulent, or not actually proof of the individual's own age in
- 15 order to obtain possession of, purchase, or receive a cigarette,
- 16 e-cigarette, or tobacco product.
- 17 (b) It is an exception to the application of this section
- 18 that the individual younger than 21 [18] years of age possessed the
- 19 cigarette, e-cigarette, or tobacco product in the presence of:
- 20 (1) an adult parent, a guardian, or a spouse of the
- 21 individual; or
- 22 (2) an employer of the individual, if possession or
- 23 receipt of the cigarette, e-cigarette, or tobacco product is
- 24 required in the performance of the employee's duties as an
- 25 employee.
- 26 (c) It is an exception to the application of this section
- 27 that the individual younger than 21  $[\frac{18}{18}]$  years of age is

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- 1 participating in an inspection or test of compliance in accordance
- 2 with Section 161.088.
- 3 SECTION 11. Sections 161.452(b) and (c), Health and Safety
- 4 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 5 (b) A person taking a delivery sale order of cigarettes
- 6 shall comply with:
- 7 (1) the age verification requirements prescribed by
- 8 Section 161.453;
- 9 (2) the disclosure requirements prescribed by Section
- 10 161.454;
- 11 (3) [the shipping requirements prescribed by Section
- 12 161.455;
- 13  $\left[\frac{4}{1}\right]$  the registration and reporting requirements
- 14 prescribed by Section 161.456;
- 15  $\underline{(4)}$  [ $\underline{(5)}$ ] the tax collection requirements prescribed
- 16 by Section 161.457; and
- (5)  $\left[\frac{(6)}{(6)}\right]$  each law of this state that generally
- 18 applies to sales of cigarettes that occur entirely within this
- 19 state, including a law:
- 20 (A) imposing a tax; or
- 21 (B) prescribing a permitting or tax-stamping
- 22 requirement.
- 23 (c) A person taking a delivery sale order of e-cigarettes
- 24 shall comply with:
- 25 (1) the age verification requirements prescribed by
- 26 Section 161.453;
- 27 (2) the disclosure requirements prescribed by Section

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1 161.454;
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- 2 (3) [the shipping requirements prescribed by Section
- 3 161.455;
- 4  $\left[\frac{(4)}{(4)}\right]$  the registration and reporting requirements
- 5 prescribed by Section 161.456; and
- (4) (4) (5) each law of this state that generally
- 7 applies to sales of e-cigarettes that occur entirely within this
- 8 state.
- 9 SECTION 12. Sections 161.453(a) and (c), Health and Safety
- 10 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) A person may not mail or ship cigarettes in connection
- 12 with a delivery sale order unless before mailing or shipping the
- 13 cigarettes the person accepting the delivery sale order first:
- 14 (1) obtains from the prospective customer a
- 15 certification that includes:
- 16 (A) reliable confirmation that the purchaser is
- 17 at least 21 [<del>18</del>] years of age; and
- 18 (B) a statement signed by the prospective
- 19 purchaser in writing and under penalty of law:
- 20 (i) certifying the prospective purchaser's
- 21 address and date of birth;
- 22 (ii) confirming that the prospective
- 23 purchaser understands that signing another person's name to the
- 24 certification is illegal, that sales of cigarettes to an individual
- 25 under the age prescribed by Section 161.082 are illegal under state
- 26 law, and that the purchase of cigarettes by an individual under that
- 27 age is illegal under state law; and

- 1 (iii) confirming that the prospective
- 2 purchaser wants to receive mailings from a tobacco company;
- 3 (2) makes a good faith effort to verify the
- 4 information contained in the certification provided by the
- 5 prospective purchaser under Subdivision (1) against a commercially
- 6 available database or obtains a photocopy or other image of a
- 7 government-issued identification bearing a photograph of the
- 8 prospective purchaser and stating the date of birth or age of the
- 9 prospective purchaser;
- 10 (3) sends to the prospective purchaser, by e-mail or
- 11 other means, a notice that complies with Section 161.454; and
- 12 (4) for an order made over the Internet or as a result
- 13 of an advertisement, receives payment for the delivery sale from
- 14 the prospective purchaser by a credit or debit card that has been
- 15 issued in the purchaser's name or by check.
- 16 (c) A person may not mail or ship e-cigarettes in connection
- 17 with a delivery sale order unless before accepting a delivery sale
- 18 order the person verifies that the prospective purchaser is at
- 19 least 21 [<del>18</del>] years of age through a commercially available
- 20 database or aggregate of databases that is regularly used for the
- 21 purpose of age and identity verification. After the order is
- 22 accepted, the person must use a method of mailing or shipping that
- 23 requires an adult signature.
- SECTION 13. Section 161.455, Health and Safety Code, is
- 25 repealed.
- SECTION 14. (a) The changes in law made by this Act to
- 27 Subchapters H, N, and R, Chapter 161, Health and Safety Code, apply

- 1 only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this
- 2 Act. For purposes of this section, an offense is committed before
- 3 the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurs
- 4 before that date.
- 5 (b) An offense committed before the effective date of this
- 6 Act is covered by the law in effect when the offense was committed,
- 7 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 8 SECTION 15. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
