A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the repeal of certain laws regulating the sale or 1-19 1-20 transfer of secondhand watches. 1-21

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 1-23 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 17, Business & Commerce Code, is repealed.

1-24 SECTION 2. An offense under Section 17.22, Business & Commerce Code, may not be prosecuted after the effective date of 1-25 this Act. If on the effective date of this Act a criminal action is pending for an offense under Section 17.22, Business & Commerce 1-26 1-27 1-28 Code, the action is dismissed on that date. However, a final conviction for an offense under Section 17.22, Business & Commerce 1-29 1-30 Code, that exists on the effective date of this Act is unaffected by 1-31 this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 1-32 1-33 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 1-34 1-35 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 1-36 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
