1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
 1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to recommendations regarding instruction in public  
 1-22 schools to prevent the use of e-cigarettes.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Section 28.004(c), Education Code, is amended to  
 1-25 read as follows:

1-26 (c) The local school health advisory council's duties  
 1-27 include recommending:

1-28 (1) the number of hours of instruction to be provided  
 1-29 in health education;

1-30 (2) policies, procedures, strategies, and curriculum  
 1-31 appropriate for specific grade levels designed to prevent obesity,  
 1-32 cardiovascular disease, Type 2 diabetes, and mental health concerns  
 1-33 through coordination of:

- 1-34 (A) health education;
- 1-35 (B) physical education and physical activity;
- 1-36 (C) nutrition services;
- 1-37 (D) parental involvement;
- 1-38 (E) instruction to prevent the use of  
 1-39 e-cigarettes, as defined by Section 161.081, Health and Safety  
 1-40 Code, and tobacco;

- 1-41 (F) school health services;
- 1-42 (G) counseling and guidance services;
- 1-43 (H) a safe and healthy school environment; and
- 1-44 (I) school employee wellness;

1-45 (3) appropriate grade levels and methods of  
 1-46 instruction for human sexuality instruction;

1-47 (4) strategies for integrating the curriculum  
 1-48 components specified by Subdivision (2) with the following elements  
 1-49 in a coordinated school health program for the district:

- 1-50 (A) school health services;
- 1-51 (B) counseling and guidance services;
- 1-52 (C) a safe and healthy school environment; and
- 1-53 (D) school employee wellness; and

1-54 (5) if feasible, joint use agreements or strategies  
 1-55 for collaboration between the school district and community  
 1-56 organizations or agencies.

1-57 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
 1-58 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
 1-59 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
 1-60 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
 1-61 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
