1-19 relating to the term of a chief administrative law judge.
 1-20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
 1-21 SECTION 1. Section 2003.022(a), Government Code, is amended
 1-22 to read as follows:
 1-23 (a) The office is under the direction of a chief
 1-24 administrative law judge appointed by the governor for a two-year
 1-25 term that expires on May 15 of each even-numbered year. The chief
 1-26 administrative law judge is eligible for reappointment.
 1-27 SECTION 2. Section 2003.022(a), Government Code, as amended
 1-28 by this Act, applies only to a chief administrative law judge
 1-29 appointed under that section on or after the effective date of this
 1-30 Act. A chief administrative law judge appointed before the
 1-31 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect
 1-32 immediately before that date and that law is continued in effect for
 1-33 that purpose.
 1-34 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
