Section 370.318, Transportation Code, as added by this Act, applies only to a grant or loan agreement that is entered into on or after the effective date of this Act. A grant or loan agreement that is entered into before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the agreement was entered into, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
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
