AN ACT

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 1-23 SECTION 1. Section 533.005, Government Code, is amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows: 1-24

(<u>a)(1</u>3), 1-25 (d) For purposes of Subsection an advanced practice registered nurse may be included as a primary care provider in a managed care organization's provider network regardless of whether the physician supervising the advanced practice registered nurse is in the provider network. This 1-26 1-27 1-28 1-29 subsection may not be construed as authorizing a managed care organization to supervise or control the practice of medicine as prohibited by Subtitle B, Title 3, Occupations Code.
