1-21 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-22 AN ACT

1-23 relating to the composition of the Texas Historical Commission.
 1-24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
 1-25 SECTION 1. Section 442.002(b), Government Code, is amended
 1-26 to read as follows:
 1-27 (b) The commission is composed of 15 [~~nine~~] members
 1-28 appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate.
 1-29 One member must have expertise in archeology, preferably as a
 1-30 professional archeologist, one must have expertise in history,
 1-31 preferably as a professional historian, and one must have expertise
 1-32 in architecture, preferably as a professional architect who is
 1-33 licensed in this state and has expertise in historic preservation
 1-34 and architectural history. The remaining members must represent
 1-35 the general public. A person is [~~may~~] not eligible for appointment
 1-36 as [~~be~~] a member of the commission if the person or the person's
 1-37 spouse:
 1-38 (1) owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more
 1-39 than a 10 percent interest in a business entity or other
 1-40 organization regulated by the commission or receiving money other
 1-41 than grant money from the commission;
 1-42 (2) uses or receives a substantial amount of tangible
 1-43 goods, services, or money from the commission, other than
 1-44 compensation or reimbursement authorized by law for commission
 1-45 membership, attendance, or expenses; or
 1-46 (3) is employed by or participates in the management
 1-47 of a business entity or other organization regulated by or
 1-48 receiving money other than grant money from the commission.
 1-49 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
 1-50 of this Act, the governor shall appoint six additional members to
 1-51 the Texas Historical Commission as required by Section 442.002(b),
 1-52 Government Code, as amended by this Act. In appointing the
 1-53 additional members to the commission, the governor shall appoint:
 1-54 (1) two members, including one member with archeology
 1-55 expertise, to terms expiring February 1, 2019;
 1-56 (2) two members, including one member with history
 1-57 expertise, to terms expiring February 1, 2021; and
 1-58 (3) two members, including one member with
 1-59 architecture expertise, to terms expiring February 1, 2023.
 1-60 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
