1-19 relating to designating July 7 as Fallen Law Enforcement Officer
 1-20 Day.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
 1-22 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 662, Government Code, is
 1-23 amended by adding Section 662.066 to read as follows:

1-24 Sec. 662.066. FALLEN LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER DAY.

1-25 (a) July 7 is Fallen Law Enforcement Officer Day in recognition of
 1-26 the ultimate sacrifice made by Texas law enforcement officers
 1-27 killed in the line of duty.

1-28 (b) Fallen Law Enforcement Officer Day shall be regularly
 1-29 observed by appropriate ceremonies.

1-30 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 1-31 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 1-32 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 1-33 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 1-34 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
