S.B. No. 970

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to a sexual assault policy at public and private 2 3 institutions of higher education. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 51.9363, Education Code, is amended to 5 6 read as follows: Sec. 51.9363. [CAMPUS] SEXUAL ASSAULT POLICY. (a) In this 7 "postsecondary educational institution" means 8 section, an ["]institution of higher education or a private or independent 9 institution of higher education, as those terms are defined [" has 10 the meaning assigned] by Section 61.003. 11 12 (b) Each postsecondary educational institution [of higher 13 education] shall adopt a policy on [campus] sexual assault applicable to each student enrolled at and each employee of the 14 15 institution. The policy must: (1)include: 16 definitions of prohibited behavior; 17 (A) sanctions for violations; and 18 (B) 19 the protocol for reporting and responding to (C) reports of [campus] sexual assault; and 20 21 (2) be approved by the institution's governing board 22 before final adoption by the institution. 23 (c) Each postsecondary educational institution [of higher 24 education] shall make the institution's [campus] sexual assault

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1 policy available to students, faculty, and staff members by:

2 (1) including the policy in the institution's student3 handbook and personnel handbook; and

4 (2) creating and maintaining a web page on the 5 institution's Internet website dedicated solely to the policy.

Each postsecondary educational institution [of higher 6 (d) 7 education] shall require each entering freshman or undergraduate transfer student to attend an orientation on the institution's 8 9 [campus] sexual assault policy before or during the first semester or term in which the student is enrolled at the institution. 10 The 11 institution shall establish the format and content of the orientation. 12

13 (e) <u>Each postsecondary educational institution shall</u> 14 <u>develop and implement a public awareness campaign to inform</u> 15 <u>students enrolled at and employees of the institution of the</u> 16 <u>institution's sexual assault policy.</u>

17 (f) Each biennium, each <u>postsecondary educational</u> 18 institution [<del>of higher education</del>] shall review the institution's 19 [<del>campus</del>] sexual assault policy and, with approval of the 20 institution's governing board, revise the policy as necessary.

21 SECTION 2. Section 51.9363, Education Code, as amended by 22 this Act, applies beginning with the 2017 fall semester.

23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
