A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the Texas Funeral Service Commission; authorizing fees. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 651.051(a), Occupations Code, is amended 4 5 to read as follows: The Texas Funeral Service Commission consists of seven 6 (a) 7 members appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate as follows: 8 (1) two members who are licensed as both an embalmer 9 and a funeral director for at least the five years preceding 10 11 appointment to the commission; 12 (2) one member who is <u>licensed as a funeral director</u> and is a registered cemetery owner or operator; and 13 14 (3) four members who represent the public and who: are not regulated under this chapter; and 15 (A) 16 (B) have consistently shown an interest in supporting consumer protection. 17 SECTION 2. Section 651.055(c), Occupations Code, is amended 18 to read as follows: 19 It is a ground for removal from the commission that a 20 (c) 21 member: 22 (1) does not have at the time of appointment the 23 qualifications required by Sections 651.051(a) and (c) and 24 651.052(a);

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S.B. No. 983 1 (2) does not maintain during service on the commission the qualifications required by Sections 651.051(a) and (c) and 2 3 651.052(a); 4 (3) violates a prohibition established by Section 651.053 [Sections 651.053(a)-(e) or 651.506(h)]; 5 6 (4) cannot because of illness or disability discharge the member's duties for a substantial part of the term for which the 7 8 member is appointed; or 9 (5) is absent for more than half of the regularly scheduled commission meetings that the member is eligible to attend 10 during a calendar year unless the absence is excused by majority 11 vote of the commission. 12 SECTION 3. The heading to Section 651.101, Occupations 13 14 Code, is amended to read as follows: 15 Sec. 651.101. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR[; BOND]. 16 SECTION 4. [(c)] The commission may 22 appoint a committee from its members to consider and make a 23 24 recommendation on a matter referred to the committee by the 25 commission. 26 SECTION 6. Section 651.154, Occupations Code, is amended to 27 read as follows:

Sec. 651.154. FEES. (a) The commission shall set the 1 following fees in amounts reasonable and necessary to administer 2 3 this chapter: 4 (1)the funeral director's and embalmer's application 5 fee, license fee, renewal fee, late renewal penalty, duplicate license fee, replacement license fee, and reciprocal license fee; 6 7 and 8 (2) the cemetery, crematory, or funeral establishment license fee, renewal fee, and late renewal penalty. 9 (b) The commission shall set the provisional license 10 application fee, examination fee, renewal fee, and late renewal 11 12 penalty in amounts reasonable and necessary to administer the 13 provisional license program. 14 (C) The commission shall set the following fees in amounts 15 reasonable and necessary to administer the continuing education program under this chapter: 16 17 (1) the continuing education provider fee and continuing education course fee; and 18 19 (2) the continuing education noncompliance fee [may not charge a fee to a perpetual care cemetery, including a fee for 20 issuing or renewing a license issued under this chapter]. 21 SECTION 7. Sections 651.157, 651.1571, and 651.158, 22 Occupations Code, are amended to read as follows: 23 24 Sec. 651.157. INSPECTION OF $[CEMETERY_{\tau}]$ CREMATORY $[\tau]$ OR 25 FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT. (a) A crematory or funeral establishment 26 must be inspected before an initial license may be issued to the crematory or funeral establishment. 27

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1 <u>(a-1)</u> Except as provided by Subsection (b), a [licensed 2 cemetery,] crematory[,] or funeral establishment shall be 3 inspected at least once every two years by an agent of the 4 commission or by an agent of the state or a political subdivision 5 authorized by the commission to make inspections on its behalf.

(b) If the commission finds a violation of this chapter or
of Chapter 193, 361, 711, 714, 715, or 716, Health and Safety Code,
the commission shall inspect the [cemetery,] crematory[,] or
funeral establishment annually until the commission determines
that the crematory or funeral establishment is free of violations.

11 (c) A report of each inspection made under this section 12 shall be <u>retained in the crematory's or funeral establishment's</u> 13 <u>licensing file</u> [filed with the commission].

14

(d) The commission by rule shall establish:

15 (1) procedures for the inspection of a $[\frac{\text{cemetery}_r}{r}]$ crematory $[\tau]$ or funeral establishment required by this section; and 16 17 (2) criteria, including consideration of the crematory's or funeral establishment's inspection and complaint 18 19 history, regarding when the commission should inspect a crematory or funeral [an] establishment based on the risk of a violation at a 20 crematory or funeral [an] establishment. 21

(e) A premises on which funeral directing, [interment,]
cremation, or embalming is practiced shall be open at all times to
inspection for any violation of this chapter or of Chapter 193, 361,
or 716, Health and Safety Code, by:

26 (1) an agent of the commission;
27 (2) an authorized agent of the state; or

S.B. No. 983 (3) an authorized agent of the county or municipality 2 in which the premises is located.

3 (f) Before a commission agent inspects a [cemetery,] crematory[,] or funeral establishment, the agent shall review the 4 5 inspection reports filed with the commission on the crematory or funeral establishment. During the inspection, the agent shall 6 determine whether previously identified problems 7 have been 8 corrected and whether a pattern of violations exists. The commission shall consider the information from the inspection 9 10 reports in determining whether a penalty should be imposed against <u>a crematory or funeral</u> [an] establishment. 11

Sec. 651.1571. INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN CEMETERIES[; EXCEPTION FOR PERPETUAL CARE CEMETERIES]. (a) <u>A</u> cemetery licensed by the commission [This section and Section <u>651.157 do not apply to perpetual care cemeteries.</u>

[(b) Except as provided by Section 651.157(b):

17 [(1) a cemetery] may not be inspected unless:

18 (1) [(A)] an interment has occurred in the cemetery 19 within the two years preceding the inspection; or

20 (2) [(B)] the commission has received a complaint 21 about the cemetery.

22 (b) The[; and

[(2) the] commission shall give lower priority to an inspection of a cemetery than to an inspection of a crematory or funeral establishment.

26 Sec. 651.158. INSPECTION OF CERTAIN FACILITIES. (a) The 27 commission may require a funeral establishment that has solid waste

1 disposal and sanitation facilities that have not been inspected by 2 the [Texas] Department of <u>State</u> Health <u>Services</u> to obtain 3 inspection of those facilities by an entity other than the [Texas] 4 Department of State Health Services.

5 (b) The commission by rule shall establish procedures for an6 inspection required under this section.

7 SECTION 8. Sections 651.160(a) and (b), Occupations Code, 8 are amended to read as follows:

9 (a) The commission and the [Texas] Department of <u>State</u> 10 Health <u>Services</u> shall adopt a joint memorandum of understanding 11 that:

(1) outlines the responsibilities of each agency in enforcing requirements under Chapters 193 and 361, Health and Safety Code, that affect funeral establishments;

2 (3) the name of the person who filed the complaint;

4 the complaint;

The approval is subject to review by the entire commission.

25 [(c) The commission shall keep a permanent, alphabetical 26 record of each license application and the action taken on the 27 application. The record must indicate the current status of each

1 application and license issued].

For an 9 initial license that is issued for a term of less than 24 months 10 [the year in which the license expiration date is changed], the 11 12 commission shall prorate license fees on a monthly basis so that each license holder pays only that portion of the license fee that 13 14 is allocable to the number of months during which the license is 15 valid. On renewal of the license on the new expiration date, the total license renewal fee is payable. 16

12 [(2) attains a grade of at least 75 percent on the 13 written examination given by the commission].

APPLICATION BY OUT-OF-STATE LICENSE HOLDER. 3 (a) The commission shall waive any requirement for a funeral 4 5 director's license or an embalmer's license for an applicant who holds a license issued by another state, country, or territory that 6 license requirements substantially equivalent to 7 has the 8 requirements of this state and who meets the requirements of this section. The commission may waive any license requirement for an 9 10 applicant who holds a license issued by another state that does not have license requirements substantially equivalent to those of this 11 12 state and who meets the requirements of this section. [The applicant shall pay a license fee in an amount set by the 13 14 commission.]

11 (3) documentation that the applicant has graduated 12 from an accredited college of mortuary science.

13 (c) The affidavit must be made by:

14 (1) the presiding officer or secretary of the15 governmental entity that issued the license; or

16 (2) a registration officer of the state, country, or17 territory that issued the license.

11 Sec. 651.261. POSTING OF LICENSE. <u>(a)</u> A license holder 12 shall conspicuously display the holder's <u>original</u> license, 13 <u>duplicate original license, or replacement license</u> in each place of 14 business at which the license holder practices.

The commission by rule may require continuing education as a condition for license renewal except for a license holder described by Section 651.155 or an applicant for renewal described by Section <u>651.265(b)</u> [<u>651.265</u>]. If the commission requires continuing education, the commission shall require completion of a minimum number of hours of ethics training as a required part of that education.

1 SECTION 22. Section 651.165, Occupations Code, is 2 transferred to Subchapter F, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, 3 redesignated as Section 651.2661, Occupations Code, and amended to 4 read as follows:

another state, and is currently licensed and has been in practice in the other state for the two years preceding the date of application may obtain a new license without reexamination <u>if both licenses are</u> <u>in good standing</u>. The person must pay to the commission a fee that is equal to two times the normally required renewal fee for the license.

7 (f) At least 30 days before the expiration of a person's 8 license, the commission shall send written notice of the impending 9 license expiration to the person at the person's last known address 10 according to the records of the commission.

SECTION 59. Section 651.267, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to a person who applies for reissuance of a license on or after the effective date of this Act. A person who applies for reissuance of a license before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the person applied for reissuance, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 60. Section 651.502, Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to a person who applies for the issuance or renewal of a license on or after the effective date of this Act. A person who applies for the issuance or renewal of a license before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the person applied, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

1 SECTION 61. Section 651.5029, Occupations Code, as added by 2 this Act, applies only to a violation that occurs on or after the 3 effective date of this Act. A violation that occurs before the 4 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the 5 date the violation occurred, and the former law is continued in 6 effect for that purpose.

7 SECTION 62. Section 651.505, Occupations Code, as amended 8 by this Act, applies only to a person placed on probation on or 9 after the effective date of this Act. A person placed on probation 10 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in 11 effect on the date the person was placed on probation, and the 12 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

SECTION 63. Section 651.506, Occupations Code, as amended 13 14 this Act, and Section 651.50601, Occupations Code, by as 15 redesignated and amended by this Act, apply only to a proceeding initiated on or after the effective date of this Act. A proceeding 16 17 initiated before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the proceeding was initiated, and the 18 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 19

20 SECTION 64. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
