 1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to access to criminal history record information by an
 1-20 emergency communication district.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 411, Government Code, is
 1-23 amended by adding Section 411.1297 to read as follows:

1-24 Sec. 411.1297. ACCESS TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD
 1-25 INFORMATION: EMPLOYMENT BY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION DISTRICT.

1-26 (a) An emergency communication district created under Chapter
 1-27 772, Health and Safety Code, is entitled to obtain from the
 1-28 department criminal history record information maintained by the
 1-29 department that relates to a person who is:

1-30 (1) an applicant for employment by or an employee of
 1-31 the district;

1-32 (2) an applicant for a volunteer position or a
 1-33 volunteer with the district; or

1-34 (3) an applicant for employment by or an employee of a
 1-35 person that contracts with the district.

1-36 (b) Criminal history record information obtained by an
 1-37 emergency communication district under Subsection (a) may not be
 1-38 released or disclosed to any person except:

1-39 (1) in a criminal proceeding;

1-40 (2) on court order; or

1-41 (3) with the consent of the person who is the subject
 1-42 of the criminal history record information.

1-43 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
