1-20 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-21 AN ACT

1-22 relating to designation of mathematics innovation zones by the
 1-23 commissioner of education and to the establishment of pay for
 1-24 success programs to provide necessary funding.

1-25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-26 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
 1-27 amended by adding Section 28.020 to read as follows:

1-28 Sec. 28.020. MATHEMATICS INNOVATION ZONES. (a) The
 1-29 commissioner may:

1-30 (1) on application of a school district or
 1-31 open-enrollment charter school, designate a campus of the district
 1-32 or school as a mathematics innovation zone; and

1-33 (2) from funds appropriated or donated for purposes of
 1-34 this section, award a grant to support implementation of innovative
 1-35 mathematics instruction at the campus in accordance with this
 1-36 section.

1-37 (a-1) The total amount of grants awarded under this section
 1-38 during the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, may not
 1-39 exceed \$12.5 million. This subsection expires December 1, 2019.

1-40 (b) A campus designated as a mathematics innovation zone
 1-41 must:

1-42 (1) implement with fidelity an innovative mathematics
 1-43 instructional program approved by the commissioner for purposes of
 1-44 this section that addresses the essential knowledge and skills of
 1-45 the mathematics curriculum required by Section 28.002;

1-46 (2) comply with objectives, metrics, and other
 1-47 mathematics innovation zone requirements imposed by the
 1-48 commissioner through rules adopted under Subsection (g); and

1-49 (3) provide all data relating to the mathematics
 1-50 innovation zone requested by the agency.

1-51 (c) A campus designated as a mathematics innovation zone is
 1-52 not subject to interventions under the state accountability system
 1-53 described by Section 39.107(a) or (e) for the first two years of the
 1-54 designation, provided that the campus implements the instructional
 1-55 program with fidelity and complies with each mathematics innovation
 1-56 zone requirement to the satisfaction of the commissioner. The
 1-57 period that a campus is exempt from interventions as provided by
 1-58 this subsection is not:

1-59 (1) included in calculating consecutive school years
 1-60 under Section 39.107(a) or (e); or

2-1 (2) considered a break in consecutive school years of
2-2 unacceptable ratings for purposes of determining the need for
2-3 intervention under Section 39.107(a) or (e).

2-4 (d) The commissioner may revoke designation of a campus as a
2-5 mathematics innovation zone and suspend associated grant funding if
2-6 the commissioner determines that the campus has failed to implement
2-7 the instructional program with fidelity or comply with any
2-8 requirement imposed under this section.

2-9 (e) A school district or open-enrollment charter school may
2-10 use a pay for success program approved by the commissioner under
2-11 Section 44.904 to pay costs associated with designation of a campus
2-12 as a mathematics innovation zone.

2-13 (f) The commissioner may accept gifts, grants, or donations
2-14 from any public or private source for purposes of this section.

2-15 (g) The commissioner may adopt rules as necessary to
2-16 administer this section.

2-17 (h) A decision or determination by the commissioner under
2-18 this section is final and may not be appealed.

2-19 SECTION 2. Subchapter Z, Chapter 44, Education Code, is
2-20 amended by adding Section 44.904 to read as follows:

2-21 Sec. 44.904. PAY FOR SUCCESS PROGRAMS. (a) In this
2-22 section, "pay for success program" means a program involving
2-23 private financing under which payments are dependent on achievement
2-24 of measurable outcomes.

2-25 (b) The commissioner may:

2-26 (1) structure and approve pay for success programs for
2-27 use by a school district or open-enrollment charter school;

2-28 (2) evaluate and approve the following participants in
2-29 a pay for success program:

2-30 (A) a private investor;

2-31 (B) an education service provider; and

2-32 (C) a third-party evaluator; and

2-33 (3) require an approved participant to comply with the
2-34 objectives, metrics, and other pay for success program requirements
2-35 prescribed by the commissioner.

2-36 (c) In evaluating a potential participant under Subsection
2-37 (b)(2), the commissioner may:

2-38 (1) verify the availability and liquidity of the
2-39 investment funds of a private investor;

2-40 (2) evaluate the credentials and effectiveness of an
2-41 education service provider; and

2-42 (3) evaluate the credentials and independence of a
2-43 third-party evaluator.

2-44 (d) Notwithstanding any other law, a school district or
2-45 open-enrollment charter school that uses a pay for success program
2-46 approved by the commissioner is not subject to state procurement
2-47 requirements that would otherwise apply to the activity funded
2-48 through the program.

2-49 (e) The commissioner, the agency, and agency employees are
2-50 immune from liability for actions associated with the structuring,
2-51 approval, or implementation of a pay for success program.

2-52 (f) The commissioner may adopt rules as necessary to
2-53 implement this section.

2-54 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
