A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the Gulf Coast Waste Disposal Authority. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 1-17 1-18

1-19 SECTION 1. Section 1.02, Chapter 409, Acts of the 61st Legislature, Regular Session, 1969, is amended to read as follows: 1-20

Sec. 1.02. FINDINGS AND DECLARATION OF POLICY. It is hereby found and declared that the quality of waters in Chambers, Galveston, and Harris Counties is materially affected by the disposal of wastes throughout those counties; that regional 1-21 1-22 1-23 1-24 1-25 approaches to studying water pollution in these counties, to planning corrective and preventive measures, to providing 1-26 coordinated facilities for waste disposal, and to regulating waste disposal would be far more effective than efforts on a county-wide, 1-27 1-28 1-29 city-wide, or smaller scale; that solid wastes, as well as other kinds of waste, may impair water quality by seepage, drainage, and otherwise; that creation of the Gulf Coast [Waste Disposal] Authority would advance the established policy of the state to 1-30 1-31 1-32 1-33 maintain the quality of the waters in the state consistent with the public health and public enjoyment thereof, the propagation and protection of terrestrial and aquatic life, the operation of 1-34 1-35 existing industries, and the economic development of the state; and 1-36 that impending shortage of water in the district for beneficial uses requires that all reasonable measures be taken to prevent and 1-37 1-38 1-39 abate water pollution, and to reclaim polluted water for beneficial 1-40 uses.

1-59 SECTION 5. Section 8104.006, Special District Local Laws 1-60 Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 8104.006. RELATIONSHIP TO GULF COAST [WASTE DISPOSAL] 1-61

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AUTHORITY. The rights, powers, privileges, and functions granted to the authority under this chapter are subject to the powers 2-1 2-2 granted to the Gulf Coast [Waste Disposal] Authority in Chapter 2-3 409, Acts of the 61st Legislature, Regular Session, 1969 (Article 2-4 2**-**5 2**-**6 7621d-2, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), to provide disposal systems.

2-7 SECTION 6. Section 8104.205, Special District Local Laws 2-8 Code, is amended to read as follows:

2-17 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 2-18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 2-19 2-20 2-21 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
