9	discipline, discriminate against, or retaliate against:

11	act or omission as provided by Subsection (b); or
12	(2) a person who advises a physician assistant of the
13	physician assistant's rights under this section.
14	(b) A physician assistant may refuse to engage in an act or
15	omission relating to patient care that would constitute grounds for

- omission relating to patient care that would constitute grounds for reporting the physician assistant to the physician assistant board under Section 204.208 or that violates this chapter or a rule adopted under this chapter if the physician assistant notifies the person at the time of the refusal that the reason for refusing is that the act or omission:
- 21 (1) constitutes grounds for reporting the physician 22 assistant to the physician assistant board; or
- 23 (2) is a violation of this chapter or a rule adopted 24 under this chapter.

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1	(c) An act by a person under Subsection (a) does not
2	constitute a violation of this section if a medical peer review
3	committee determines:
4	(1) that the act or omission the physician assistant
5	refused to engage in was not:
6	(A) conduct reportable to the physician
7	assistant board under Section 204.208; or
8	(B) a violation of this chapter or a rule adopted
