1-19 relating to the veterans county service office.
1-20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
1-21 SECTION 1. Section 434.032(a), Government Code, is amended
1-22 to read as follows:
1-23 (a) In a county with a population of 200,000 or more, the
1-24 commissioners court shall maintain a veterans county service
1-25 office. The office must ~~[be]~~:
1-26 (1) be separate and distinct from other county
1-27 offices; ~~[and]~~
1-28 (2) be staffed by at least one full-time employee; and
1-29 (3) report directly to the commissioners court.
1-30 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
