A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-19 relating to the automatic admission of students to general academic teaching institutions. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 1-20 1-21

1**-**22 SECTION 1. Sections 51.803(a-1), (a-2), and (a-6), Education Code, are amended to read as follows: 1-23

1-24 (a-1) Beginning with admissions for the 2021-2022 [2011-2012] academic year, <u>a general academic teaching institution</u> [The University of Texas at Austin] is not required to offer admission to applicants who qualify for automatic admission under Subsection (a) in excess of the number required to fill <u>30</u> [75] 1-25 1-26 1-27 1-28 percent of the institution's [university's] enrollment capacity 1-29 designated for first-time resident undergraduate students in an academic year. If the number of applicants who qualify for 1-30 academic year. SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply beginning with admissions to a general academic teaching institution for the 2021-2022 academic year. Admissions to a general academic teaching institution for an academic period before 2-33 2-34 2-35 2-36 2-37 that academic year are governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former law is 2-38 2-39 continued in effect for that purpose.

2-40 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
