- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter M, Chapter 411,
- 6 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER M. SILVER ALERT FOR MISSING SENIOR CITIZENS AND PERSONS
- 8 WITH ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE
- 9 SECTION 2. Sections 411.381(1) and (2), Government Code,
- 10 are amended to read as follows:
- 11 (1) "Alert" means the statewide silver alert for
- 12 missing senior citizens and persons with Alzheimer's disease, as
- 13 developed and implemented under this subchapter.
- 14 (2) "Local law enforcement agency" means a local law
- 15 enforcement agency with jurisdiction over the investigation of a
- 16 missing senior citizen or person with Alzheimer's disease.
- SECTION 3. Section 411.382, Government Code, is amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 411.382. SILVER ALERT FOR MISSING SENIOR CITIZENS AND
- 20 PERSONS WITH ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE. With the cooperation of the
- 21 Texas Department of Transportation, the office of the governor, and
- 22 other appropriate law enforcement agencies in this state, the
- 23 department shall develop and implement a statewide silver alert to
- 24 be activated on behalf of a missing senior citizen or person with

- 1 Alzheimer's disease.
- 2 SECTION 4. Section 411.383(b), Government Code, is amended
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 (b) The director shall adopt rules and issue directives as
- 5 necessary to ensure proper implementation of the alert. The rules
- 6 and directives must include:
- 7 (1) the procedures to be used by a local law
- 8 enforcement agency to verify whether a person reported missing is a
- 9 senior citizen with [+
- 10 [(A) is missing; and
- 11 [(B) has] an impaired mental condition <u>or a</u>
- 12 person with Alzheimer's disease and whether the person's location
- 13 is unknown;
- 14 (2) a description of the circumstances under which a
- 15 local law enforcement agency is required to report a missing senior
- 16 citizen or person with Alzheimer's disease to the department; and
- 17 (3) the procedures to be used by an individual or
- 18 entity to report information about a missing senior citizen or
- 19 person with Alzheimer's disease to designated media outlets in
- 20 Texas.
- 21 SECTION 5. Section 411.386, Government Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- Sec. 411.386. NOTIFICATION TO DEPARTMENT OF MISSING SENIOR
- 24 CITIZEN OR PERSON WITH ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE. (a) A local law
- 25 enforcement agency may notify the department if the agency:
- 26 (1) receives notice of a missing senior citizen or
- 27 person with Alzheimer's disease;

- 1 (2) verifies that at the time the senior citizen $\underline{\text{or}}$
- 2 person with Alzheimer's disease is reported missing:
- 3 (A) the person reported missing:
- 4 <u>(i)</u> is 65 years of age or older <u>and has an</u>
- 5 impaired mental condition; or
- 6 (ii) is a person with Alzheimer's disease;
- 7 and
- 8 (B) the person's [senior citizen's] location is
- 9 unknown; and
- 10 [(C) the senior citizen has an impaired mental
- 11 condition; and]
- 12 (3) determines that the <u>person's</u> [senior citizen's]
- 13 disappearance poses a credible threat to the person's [senior
- 14 citizen's health and safety.
- 15 (b) The local law enforcement agency shall:
- 16 (1) require the family or legal guardian of the
- 17 missing senior citizen or person with Alzheimer's disease to
- 18 provide documentation of the person's age and [senior citizen's
- 19 impaired mental condition to verify the person's status
- 20 [condition] as described [required] by Subsection (a)(2)(A)
- 21 $[\frac{(a)(2)(C)}{(a)}]$; and
- 22 (2) as soon as practicable, determine whether the
- 23 person's [senior citizen's] disappearance poses a credible threat
- 24 to the person's [senior citizen's] health and safety for purposes of
- 25 Subsection (a)(3).
- SECTION 6. Section 411.387(b), Government Code, is amended
- 27 to read as follows:

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- 1 (b) In issuing the alert, the department shall send the
- 2 alert to designated media outlets in Texas. Following receipt of
- 3 the alert, participating radio stations and $[\tau]$ television
- 4 stations $[\tau]$ and other participating media outlets may issue the
- 5 alert at designated intervals to assist in locating the missing
- 6 senior citizen or person with Alzheimer's disease.
- 7 SECTION 7. Section 411.388, Government Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 411.388. CONTENT OF SILVER ALERT. The alert must
- 10 include:
- 11 (1) all appropriate information that is provided by
- 12 the local law enforcement agency and that may lead to the safe
- 13 recovery of the missing senior citizen or person with Alzheimer's
- 14 disease; and
- 15 (2) a statement instructing any person with
- 16 information related to the missing senior citizen or person with
- 17 Alzheimer's disease to contact a local law enforcement agency.
- SECTION 8. Section 411.389, Government Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- Sec. 411.389. TERMINATION OF SILVER ALERT. (a) The
- 21 director shall terminate any activation of the alert with respect
- 22 to a particular missing senior citizen or person with Alzheimer's
- 23 <u>disease</u> not later than the earlier of the date on which:
- 24 (1) the missing person [senior citizen] is located or
- 25 the situation is otherwise resolved; or
- 26 (2) the notification period ends, as determined by
- 27 department rule.

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- 1 (b) A local law enforcement agency that locates a missing
 2 senior citizen or person with Alzheimer's disease who is the
 3 subject of an alert under this subchapter shall notify the
 4 department as soon as possible that the missing person [senior
 5 citizen] has been located.
- SECTION 9. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Government Code to include persons with Alzheimer's disease in the state's Silver Alert program.

The bill would also amend the Government Code to establish a "Camo Alert" program for certain missing military members. The new alert program would place the same requirements on both the Department of Public Safety and the Texas Department of Transportation that exist for the Amber, Silver, and Blue Alert programs. It is assumed that implementing the provisions of the bill could be absorbed within existing resources.

The Texas Department of Transportation, after communicating with the Federal Highway Administration, does not anticipate that the federal agency would consider the bill's "Camo Alert" program to be out of compliance with the federal Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, so long as the "Camo Alert" program includes provisions to ensure that the messages are transportation related; clear; concise; and easily understood. Further, the program would need to include provisions requiring confirmation of a person meeting the "Camo Alert" criteria.

It is assumed the costs to implement the provisions of the bill could be absorbed in existing resources.

The bill would take effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house. Otherwise, the bill would take effect September 1, 2017.
