SECTION 4. Sections 547.105(a) and (b), Transportation 2-9 2**-**10 2**-**11 Code, are amended to read as follows:

The Texas Department of Transportation shall adopt (a) 2-12 standards and specifications that:

2-13 (1)apply to lamps highway maintenance on or 2-14 construction vehicles and service vehicles; and

(2) correlate with and conform as closely as possible 2**-**15 2**-**16 and specifications approved by the American standards to 2-17 Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials.

2-18 (b) The Texas Department of Transportation may adopt standards and specifications for lighting that permit the use of 2-19 2-20 2-21 flashing lights for identification purposes on highway maintenance or construction vehicles and service vehicles.

2-22 SECTION 5. Section 547.305, Transportation Code, is amended by amending Subsections (e) and (f) and adding Subsections (e-3) 2-23 2-24 and (e-4) to read as follows:

(e) A person may not operate a highway maintenance or <u>construction vehicle</u> or service vehicle that is not equipped with lamps or that does not display lighted lamps as required by the 2**-**25 2**-**26 2-27 standards and specifications adopted by the Texas Department of 2-28 2-29 Transportation.

<u>(e-3)</u> An escort flag vehicle may be equipped with alternating or flashing blue and amber lights. <u>(e-3)</u> An 2-30 2-31

2-32 (e-4) A vehicle described by Section 545.157(a) may be equipped with flashing blue lights. 2-33 2-34

(f) In this section:

(1) "Escort flag vehicle" means a vehicle that precedes or follows an oversize or overweight vehicle described by 2-35 2-36 Subtitle E for the purpose of facilitating the safe movement of the 2-37 oversize or overweight vehicle over roads. 2-38

2-39 (2) "Security patrol vehicle" means a motor vehicle 2-40 being used for the purpose of providing security services by: 2-41 (A) a guard company described by Section

2-42 1702.108, Occupations Code; or 2-43 (B) a security officer as defined by Section

2-44 1702.002, Occupations Code. (3) [(2)] "Tow truck" means a motor vehicle or mechanical device that is adapted or used to tow, winch, or move a2-45 2-46 2-47 disabled vehicle.

2-48 SECTION 6. As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, the Texas Department of Transportation shall adopt 2-49 2-50 standards and specifications relating to lamps and lighting on 2-51 highway construction vehicles, as required by Section 547.105, Transportation Code, as amended by this Act. 2-52 2-53

SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
