A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

_	AN ACT

- 2 relating to training for employees of school districts and
- 3 open-enrollment charter schools on the prevention of sexual abuse,
- 4 sex trafficking, and other maltreatment of certain children.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 38.0041(c), Education Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (c) The methods under Subsection (b)(1) for increasing
- 9 awareness of issues regarding sexual abuse, sex trafficking, and
- 10 other maltreatment of children must include training, as provided
- 11 by this subsection, concerning prevention techniques for and
- 12 recognition of sexual abuse, sex trafficking, and all other
- 13 maltreatment of children, including the sexual abuse, sex
- 14 trafficking, and other maltreatment of children with significant
- 15 cognitive disabilities in both educational and noneducational
- 16 settings. The training:
- 17 (1) must be provided, as part of a new employee
- 18 orientation, to all new school district and open-enrollment charter
- 19 school employees and to existing district and open-enrollment
- 20 charter school employees on a schedule adopted by the agency by rule
- 21 until all district and open-enrollment charter school employees
- 22 have taken the training; and
- 23 (2) must include training concerning:
- 24 (A) factors indicating a child is at risk for

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- 1 sexual abuse, sex trafficking, or other maltreatment;
- 2 (B) likely warning signs indicating a child may
- 3 be a victim of sexual abuse, sex trafficking, or other
- 4 maltreatment;
- 5 (C) internal procedures for seeking assistance
- 6 for a child who is at risk for sexual abuse, sex trafficking, or
- 7 other maltreatment, including referral to a school counselor, a
- 8 social worker, or another mental health professional;
- 9 (D) techniques for reducing a child's risk of
- 10 sexual abuse, sex trafficking, or other maltreatment; and
- 11 (E) community organizations that have relevant
- 12 existing research-based programs that are able to provide training
- 13 or other education for school district or open-enrollment charter
- 14 school staff members, students, and parents.
- SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020
- 16 school year.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
