This Act shall be known as the Glenda Dawson Act. 1-24 The state finds that the treatment of chronic SECTION 2. 1-25 kidney disease is a tremendous expense and that the early diagnosis and effective treatment of chronic kidney disease can prolong lives 1-26 and delay the high cost of medical treatment, including dialysis 1-27 1-28 and transplantation. 1-29 SECTION 3. Subtitle D, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is 1-30 amended by adding Chapter 83 to read as follows: 1-31 CHAPTER 83. CHRONIC KIDNEY DISEASE TASK FORCE Sec. 83.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, the Chronic Kidney Disease Task Force. 1-32 "task 1-33 means CHRONIC KIDNEY DISEASE TASK FORCE. 83.002. 1-34 Sec. (a) The 1-35 Chronic Kidney Disease Task Force is composed of: 20 members appointed by the governor as follows:

(A) one family practice physician;

(B) one pathologist; 1-36 (1)1-37 1-38 <u>nephr</u>ologist 1-39 (C) one from a nephrology 1-40 department of a state medical school; (D) one nephrologist in private practice; 1-41 1-42 from the National (E) representative one Kidney 1-43 Foundation; one representative from the Texas 1-44 (F) Kidney 1-45 Foundation; 1-46 (G) representative from the South Plains one Kidney Foundation of West Texas;

(H) one representative 1-47 1-48 from the Texas Renal 1-49 Coalition; 1-50 (I)one representative from the commission's Kidney Health Care Program; 1-51 one representative of an insurer that issues benefit plan or of a health maintenance 1-52 (J) 1-53 provider preferred 1-54 organization; 1-55 one representative of clinical laboratories; (K) 1-56 (L) one representative of private renal care 1-57 providers; 1-58 (M) one pediatrician in private practice;

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one kidney transplant surgeon;

one licensed and certified renal dietitian;

one primary care physician;

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2-1 one certified nephrology nurse 2-2 (R) one representative from a health care system; 2-3 (S) one representative of the commission whose 2-4 duties involve the state Medicaid program; and

one end stage renal disease expert; (T)

(2)two members of the senate appointed by the lieutenant governor; and

(3)members of the house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.

The governor shall designate a member of the task force (b) serve as the presiding officer of the task force. The presiding officer serves at the will of the governor.

Appointments to the task force shall be made without regard to the race, color, disability, sex, religion, age, or national origin of the appointees.

83.003. DUTIES. The task force shall: Sec.

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(1) coordinate implementation of state's the cost-effective plan for prevention, early screening, diagnosis, and management of chronic kidney disease for the state's population

through national, state, and local partners; and
(2) educate health care professionals on the use clinical practice guidelines for screening, detecting, diagnosing, treating, and managing chronic kidney disease, its comorbidities, and its complications based on the Kidney Disease Outcomes Quality Clinical Practice Guidelines Initiative for Chronic Disease.

Sec. 83.004. REIMBURSEMENT. A member of the task force may receive reimbursement for travel expenses as provided by Section 2110.004, Government Code.

Sec. 83.005. ASSISTANCE. The commission shall provide administrative support to the task force, including necessary staff and meeting facilities.

Sec. 83.006. REPORT. Not later than January 1 odd-numbered year, the task force shall submit its findings and recommendations to:

(1)the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives; and

(2) the presiding officers of the appropriate standing

committees of the legislature with jurisdiction over health issues.

Sec. 83.007. FUNDING. (a) The task force, through the commission, may accept gifts and grants from individuals, private or public organizations, or federal or local funds to support the task force.

(b) The commission shall investigate any potential sources

of funding from federal grants or programs.

Sec. 83.008. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. Except as specifically provided by this chapter, Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the task force.

Sec. 83.009. TASK FORCE REVIEW AND ABOLISHMENT. (a) The commission shall review the least once every five years. review the continued need for the

(b) If the commission determines the task force is no longer needed and should be abolished, the commission shall publish notice of its decision in the Texas Register and on the commission's Internet website.
(c) The task force is abolished on the date stated in the

notice required by Subsection (b).

SECTION 4. Not later than January 1, 2020, the governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives shall appoint the members to the Chronic Kidney Disease Task Force as required by Section 83.002, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
