BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 161, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Section 161.00708 to read as follows:

Sec. 161.00708. ACCESS TO FIRST RESPONDER IMMUNIZATION 1-24 HISTORY. (a) The department shall establish a process to provide an employer of a first responder with direct access to the first responder's immunization information in the immunization registry for verification of the first responder's immunization history. 1-25 1-26 1-27 1-28 The process must require a first responder to provide electronic or 1-29 1-30 written consent before the employer is granted direct access to the 1-31 first responder's immunization information in the immunization 1-32
