1-17 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to the deployment of advanced metering and meter
1-20 information networks in certain areas outside of ERCOT.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Subchapter K, Chapter 39, Utilities Code, is
1-23 amended by adding Section 39.5021 to read as follows:

1-24 Sec. 39.5021. METERING. (a) Notwithstanding Section
1-25 39.502, an electric utility subject to this subchapter that elects
1-26 to deploy advanced metering and meter information networks may
1-27 recover reasonable and necessary costs incurred in deploying
1-28 advanced metering and meter information networks. An electric
1-29 utility that elects to deploy advanced metering or meter
1-30 information networks is subject to commission rules adopted under
1-31 Sections 39.107(h) and (k). The commission shall ensure that any
1-32 deployment plan approved under this section and any related
1-33 customer surcharge:

1-34 (1) are not applicable to customer accounts that
1-35 receive service at transmission voltage; and

1-36 (2) are consistent with commission rules related to
1-37 advanced metering systems regarding:

1-38 (A) customer protections;

1-39 (B) data security, privacy, and ownership; and

1-40 (C) options given consumers to continue to
1-41 receive service through a non-advanced meter.

1-42 (b) An electric utility subject to this subchapter that
1-43 elects to deploy an advanced meter information network shall deploy
1-44 the network as rapidly as practicable to allow customers to better
1-45 manage energy use and control costs.

1-46 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
1-47 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
1-48 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
1-49 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
1-50 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
