A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation of the Texas Rural Water Advisory Council.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Title 3, Agriculture Code, is amended by adding
5	Chapter 50D to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 50D. TEXAS RURAL WATER ADVISORY COUNCIL
7	Sec. 50D.0101. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "council"
8	means the Texas Rural Water Advisory Council.
9	Sec. 50D.0102. COMPOSITION. (a) The council is composed of
10	15 members appointed as follows:
11	(1) the executive director or the executive director's
12	designee of the following entities shall appoint a representative
13	for that entity:
14	(A) the Parks and Wildlife Department;
15	(B) the Texas Commission on Environmental
16	Quality;
17	(C) the Texas Department of Transportation; and
18	(D) the State Soil and Water Conservation Board;
19	(2) the commissioner of the Department of Agriculture
20	shall appoint a representative of that agency from the Office of
21	<pre>Water;</pre>
22	(3) the commissioner of the General Land Office shall
23	appoint a representative of that agency;
24	(4) the lieutenant governor shall appoint three

1	members with each member to represent one of the following:
2	(A) a rural county;
3	(B) an irrigation district; and
4	(C) a rural water supply corporation;
5	(5) the commissioner shall appoint three members with
6	each member representing an interest or issue under consideration
7	by the council and with the initial three members each representing
8	one of the following:
9	(A) the interests of pesticide applicators;
10	(B) the interests of a statewide nonprofit
11	organization focused on litter prevention, mitigation, and
12	abatement; and
13	(C) the interests of agricultural landowners;
14	and
15	(6) the speaker of the house of representatives shall
16	appoint three members with each member to represent one of the
17	<pre>following:</pre>
18	(A) a rural municipality;
19	(B) a river authority; and
20	(C) a drainage district.
21	(b) The council shall elect a presiding officer from among
22	<pre>its members.</pre>
23	(c) Members of the council serve staggered terms of two
24	years, with either seven or eight members' terms, as applicable,
25	expiring February 1 of each year.
26	(d) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the
27	size, composition, or duration of the council.

1 (e) Service on the council by a state officer or employee is an additional duty of the member's office or employment. Members of 2 the board are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement of 3 4 expenses. 5 (f) The council may accept gifts and grants from any source to be used to carry out a function of the council. 6 7 Sec. 50D.0103. DUTIES. On an ongoing basis, the council shall assist the department in assessing the existence of, 8 effectiveness of, or need for rural water initiatives in this state 9 regarding the prevention, mitigation, and abatement of windblown 10 and waterborne litter and illegal dumping in rural communities, 11 12 pesticide runoff from agricultural lands, rainwater harvesting, rural water use, and other topics as requested by the department by: 13 (1) identifying and evaluating best management 14 15 practices for municipal, commercial, industrial, and agricultural properties as they relate to the water initiatives assessed by this 16 17 section, including the feasibility, costs, and benefits of those practices; and 18 19 (2) evaluating: 20 (A) the feasibility and implementation needs of best management practices in different regions of the state; 21 22 (B) the jurisdiction and effectiveness of law 23 enforcement; 24 (C) the role of state funding for incentive 25 programs; and 26 (D) the appropriate state oversight and

community support efforts.

- 1 Sec. 50D.0104. MEETINGS. The council shall meet at least
- 2 twice each year and may meet at other times considered necessary by
- 3 the commissioner.
- 4 Sec. 50D.0105. STAFF. The council is administratively
- 5 attached to the Office of Water within the department. The
- 6 department shall provide the council with the staff necessary to
- 7 carry out the council's duties under this chapter.
- 8 Sec. 50D.0106. ASSISTANCE OF STATE AGENCIES. On request by
- 9 the council, a state agency shall provide assistance to the
- 10 council, including necessary support staff.
- 11 Sec. 50D.0107. BEST PRACTICES GUIDE AND REPORT TO
- 12 LEGISLATURE. (a) Not later than November 1 of each even-numbered
- 13 year, the council shall:
- 14 (1) publish a best management practices guide for use
- 15 by state agencies and counties, municipalities, and other political
- 16 <u>subdivisions responsible for initiatives identified and assessed</u>
- 17 by the council, including information on potential funding sources;
- 18 and
- 19 (2) make a report to the lieutenant governor, the
- 20 speaker of the house of representatives, and the legislative
- 21 committees with primary jurisdiction over the issues described in
- 22 the report.
- 23 (b) The report under Subsection (a) must include
- 24 recommendations on additional legislative action, if any, that is
- 25 needed to implement the recommended best management practices.
- 26 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
