1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
 1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to the repeal of the criminal penalty for a violation of  
 1-22 the interior designers licensing law.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Subchapter H, Chapter 1053, Occupations Code, is  
 1-25 repealed.

1-26 SECTION 2. The repeal by this Act of Subchapter H, Chapter  
 1-27 1053, Occupations Code, does not apply to an offense committed  
 1-28 under that subchapter before the effective date of the repeal. An  
 1-29 offense committed before the effective date of the repeal is  
 1-30 governed by the law as it existed on the date the offense was  
 1-31 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that  
 1-32 purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed  
 1-33 before the effective date of the repeal if any element of the  
 1-34 offense occurred before that date.

1-35 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
