BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 315.007, Labor Code, is amended by adding Subsections (c) and (d) to read as follows:

(c) The criteria prescribed under Subsection (b)(1) for the award of funds to entities described by Subsection (a) based on performance during a program year must include the achievement by an entity of the following enrollment target and performance benchmarks:

(1) the enrollment in a high school equivalency a postsecondary ability to benefit program of at least 25 equivalency program or percent of all students receiving adult education and literacy services from the entity during that program year; and

(2) the achievement by the end of that program year of school equivalency certificate or a postsecondary a high school equivalency certificate or a postsecondary certificate by at least 70 percent of those students who exit the entity's adult education program during that program year and who are enrolled in a high school equivalency program or a

postsecondary ability to benefit program.

(d) In this section, "postsecondary ability to benefit program" means a postsecondary certificate program in which a person who does not have a high school diploma or equivalency certificate and who both qualifies for federal student financial aid and demonstrates on an assessment instrument that the person can pass college-level courses with some support may enroll. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
