- Sec. 490H.008. EXPIRATION. This chapter expires September 2029.
- 2-61 SECTION 2. The first report described by Section 490H.007, 2-62 Government Code, as added by this Act, is due November 1, 2020.
- 2-63 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 2-64 2-65 2-66 2-67 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
