## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-17 1-18 relating to the dismissal of certain actions relating to Medicaid fraud. 1-19

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-20 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 36.102, Human Resources 1-21 Code, is amended to read as follows:

1-22 1-23 Sec. 36.102. INITIATION OF ACTION; CONSENT REQUIRED FOR DISMISSAL.

1-24 SECTION 2. Section 36.102(e), Human Resources Code, is 1-25 amended to read as follows:

1-26 (e) An action under this subchapter may be dismissed [before the end of the period during which the petition remains under seal] only if the court and the attorney general consent in writing to the dismissal and state their reasons for consenting. 1-27 1-28 1-29

SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only 1-30 1-31 to an action brought on or after the effective date of this Act. An 1-32 action brought before the effective date of this Act is governed by 1-33 the law applicable to the action immediately before the effective 1-34 date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that 1-35 purpose. 1-36

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
