1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to an active shooter emergency policy for school districts  
1-22 and required active shooter training for school district peace  
1-23 officers and school resource officers.

1-24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-25 SECTION 1. Section 37.108, Education Code, is amended by  
1-26 adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:

1-27 (f) A school district shall include in its multihazard  
1-28 emergency operations plan a policy for responding to an active  
1-29 shooter emergency. The school district may use any available  
1-30 community resources in developing the policy described by this  
1-31 subsection.

1-32 SECTION 2. Section 37.0812, Education Code, is amended to  
1-33 read as follows:

1-34 Sec. 37.0812. TRAINING POLICY: SCHOOL DISTRICT PEACE  
1-35 OFFICERS AND SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS. (a) A school district peace  
1-36 officer or school resource officer shall complete an active shooter  
1-37 response training program approved by the Texas Commission on Law  
1-38 Enforcement.

1-39 (b) A school district with an enrollment of 30,000 or more  
1-40 students that commissions a school district peace officer or at  
1-41 which a school resource officer provides law enforcement shall  
1-42 adopt a policy requiring the officer to complete the education and  
1-43 training program required by Section 1701.263, Occupations Code.

1-44 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date  
1-45 of this Act, the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall approve  
1-46 an active shooter response training program required under Section  
1-47 37.0812, Education Code, as amended by this Act.

1-48 SECTION 4. A school district peace officer or school  
1-49 resource officer who begins employment with or begins providing law  
1-50 enforcement at a school district on a date occurring before the  
1-51 effective date of this Act shall complete the training required by  
1-52 Section 37.0812, Education Code, as amended by this Act, as soon as  
1-53 practicable after the effective date of this Act but not later than  
1-54 August 31, 2020.

1-55 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
1-56 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
1-57 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
1-58 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
1-59 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
