A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to a work group on enhancing the training credentialing of emergency management personnel. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 1-17 1-18 on enhancing the training and 1-19

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act: (1) "Disaster" has the meaning assigned by Section 1-21 418.004, Government Code.

1-22 1-23 (2) "Emergency management director" and "emergency coordinator" mean the director and coordinator, 1-24 management respectively, designated under Section 418.1015, Government Code. 1-25

(3) "Work group" means the work group established under Section 2 of this Act. 1-26 1-27 1-28

The Texas Division of Emergency SECTION 2. WORK GROUP. Management shall establish a work group of persons knowledgeable on 1-29 1-30 emergency management to study and develop a proposal for enhancing 1-31 the training and credentialing of emergency management directors, emergency management coordinators, and other emergency management personnel on the state or local level. 1-32 1-33

1-34 SECTION 3. STUDY AND PROPOSAL. (a) As part of the study and proposal under Section 2 of this Act, the work group shall: (1) assess the training and credentials necessary for 1-35
