4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:								
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 2, Utilities Code, is amended								
6	by adding Chapter 19 to read as follows:								
7	CHAPTER 19. COORDINATION OF BROADBAND INSTALLATION								
8	Sec. 19.0101. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:								
9	(1) "Broadband" means a mass-market retail service by								
10	wire or radio that provides the capability to transmit data to and								
11	receive data from all or substantially all Internet endpoints,								
12	including capabilities that are incidental to and enable the								
13	operation of the service. The term includes a service that is								
14	functionally equivalent to the service described by this								
15	subdivision.								
16	(2) "Broadband conduit" means a conduit, pipe,								
17	innerduct, or microduct for fiber optic or other cables that								
18	supports broadband and wireless facilities for broadband.								
19	Sec. 19.0102. DUTIES. (a) In collaboration with the Texas								
20	Department of Transportation and private entities, the commission								
21	shall encourage and coordinate efforts to plan, relocate, install,								
22	or improve broadband conduit in highway rights-of-way in								
23	conjunction with any current or planned highway construction. To								
24	the extent necessary, in collaboration with the Texas Department of								

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1	Transportation the commission shall:							
2	(1) evaluate engineering and design standards,							
3	procedures and criteria for contracts or lease agreements, and							
4	pricing requirements; and							
5	(2) provide for allocation of risk, costs, and any							
6	revenue generated.							
7	(b) In collaboration with any other state agency the							
8	commission considers necessary, the commission shall develop a							
9	strategy to facilitate the timely and efficient deployment of							
10	broadband conduit or other broadband facilities on state-owned land							
11	and in state-owned buildings.							
12	(c) The commission shall give special consideration to							
13	projects described by Subsection (a) or (b) that are likely to							
14	improve access to broadband by rural or underserved communities.							
15	(d) To the extent practicable, the commission shall assist							
16	political subdivisions in adopting and implementing projects							
17	similar to those in Subsections (a) and (b) for the construction or							
18	improvement of roads under the jurisdiction of political							
19	subdivisions and for broadband deployment on land or in buildings							
20	owned by political subdivisions.							
21	Sec. 19.0103. REPORT. Annually, the commission shall							
22	submit to the legislature a report that explains the actions taken							
23	by the commission in carrying out this chapter, the number of							
24	current and planned projects receiving assistance from the							
25	commission, any gains in broadband speed or access associated with							
26	the projects, and any costs or cost savings to the state, private							
27	entities, or end users of broadband services associated with the							

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1	projects.							
2	SECTION 2.	This	Act	takes	effect	September	1,	2019.
