A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to workers' compensation death benefit eligibility for 1-19 1-20 certain spouses of certain employees killed in the line of duty. 1-21

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 1-23 SECTION 1. Section 408.183(b-1), Labor Code, is amended to read as follows:

1-24 (b-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), an eligible spouse 1-25 who remarried is eligible for death benefits for life if the 1-26 employee was a first responder, as defined by Section 504.055, or an individual described by Section 615.003(1), Government Code, or Section 501.001(5)(F), who suffered death in the course and scope of employment or while providing services as a volunteer. This 1-27 1-28 1-29 1-30 subsection applies regardless of the date on which the death of the 1-31

first responder <u>or other individual</u> occurred. SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act to Section 408.183(b-1), Labor Code, applies only to an eligible spouse who 1-32 1-33 remarries on or after the effective date of this Act. An eligible 1-34 spouse who remarried before that date is governed by the law as it 1-35 1-36 existed immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the 1-37 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 1-38 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
