A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to the duties of school district peace officers, school
- 3 resource officers, and security personnel.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 30.052(1), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (1) The governing board of the Texas School for the Deaf may
- 8 employ security personnel, enter into a memorandum of understanding
- 9 with a local law enforcement agency for the provision of school
- 10 resource officers, and [may] commission peace officers in the same
- 11 manner as a board of trustees of a school district under Section
- 12 37.081.
- SECTION 2. The heading to Section 37.081, Education Code,
- 14 is amended to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 37.081. SCHOOL DISTRICT PEACE OFFICERS, SCHOOL
- 16 RESOURCE OFFICERS, AND SECURITY PERSONNEL.
- SECTION 3. Section 37.081, Education Code, is amended by
- 18 amending Subsections (a) and (d) and adding Subsections (d-1),
- 19 (d-2), and (d-3) to read as follows:
- 20 (a) The board of trustees of any school district may employ
- 21 security personnel, enter into a memorandum of understanding with a
- 22 local law enforcement agency for the provision of school resource
- 23 officers, and [may] commission peace officers to carry out this
- 24 subchapter. If a board of trustees authorizes a person employed as

- 1 security personnel to carry a weapon, the person must be a
- 2 commissioned peace officer. The jurisdiction of a peace officer, a
- 3 <u>school resource officer</u>, or security personnel under this section
- 4 shall be determined by the board of trustees and may include all
- 5 territory in the boundaries of the school district and all property
- 6 outside the boundaries of the district that is owned, leased, or
- 7 rented by or otherwise under the control of the school district and
- 8 the board of trustees that employ the peace officer or security
- 9 personnel or that enter into a memorandum of understanding for the
- 10 provision of a school resource officer.
- 11 (d) The [A school district peace officer shall perform law
- 12 enforcement duties for the school district as determined by the]
- 13 board of trustees of the school district shall determine the law
- 14 enforcement duties of peace officers, school resource officers, and
- 15 <u>security personnel</u>. <u>The duties must be included in:</u>
- 16 (1) the district improvement plan under Section
- 17 11.252;
- 18 (2) the student code of conduct adopted under Section
- 19 3<u>7.001;</u>
- 20 (3) any memorandum of understanding providing for a
- 21 <u>school resource officer; and</u>
- 22 (4) any other campus or district document describing
- 23 the role of peace officers, school resource officers, or security
- 24 personnel in the district.
- 25 <u>(d-1) A school district peace officer, a school resource</u>
- 26 officer, and security personnel shall perform law enforcement
- 27 duties for the school district that [Those duties] must include

- 1 protecting:
- 2 (1) the safety and welfare of any person in the
- 3 jurisdiction of the peace officer, resource officer, or security
- 4 personnel; and
- 5 (2) the property of the school district.
- 6 (d-2) A school district may not assign or require as duties
- 7 of a school district peace officer, a school resource officer, or
- 8 security personnel:
- 9 (1) routine student discipline or school
- 10 administrative tasks; or
- 11 (2) contact with students unrelated to the law
- 12 enforcement duties of the peace officer, resource officer, or
- 13 security personnel.
- 14 (d-3) In determining the law enforcement duties under
- 15 Subsection (d), the board of trustees of the school district shall
- 16 coordinate with district campus behavior coordinators and other
- 17 district employees to ensure that school district peace officers,
- 18 school resource officers, and security personnel are tasked only
- 19 with duties related to law enforcement intervention and not tasked
- 20 with behavioral or administrative duties better addressed by other
- 21 district employees.
- 22 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
