1-17 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to an exception from required disclosure under the public
 1-20 information law for certain personal information obtained by
 1-21 certain flood control districts.

1-22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-23 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 552, Government Code, is
 1-24 amended by adding Section 552.159 to read as follows:

1-25 Sec. 552.159. EXCEPTION: CERTAIN PERSONAL INFORMATION
 1-26 OBTAINED BY FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT. The following information
 1-27 obtained by a flood control district located in a county with a
 1-28 population of 3.3 million or more in connection with operations
 1-29 related to a declared disaster or flooding is excepted from the
 1-30 requirements of Section 552.021:

- 1-31 (1) a person's name;
- 1-32 (2) a home address;
- 1-33 (3) a business address;
- 1-34 (4) a home telephone number;
- 1-35 (5) a mobile telephone number;
- 1-36 (6) an electronic mail address;
- 1-37 (7) social media account information; and
- 1-38 (8) a social security number.

1-39 SECTION 2. Section 552.159, Government Code, as added by
 1-40 this Act, applies only to a request for public information received
 1-41 on or after the effective date of this Act. A request received
 1-42 before that date is governed by the law in effect when the request
 1-43 was received, and the former law is continued in effect for that
 1-44 purpose.

1-45 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
