A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-21 relating to indicators of achievement under the public school accountability system. 1-22 1-23

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 39.053(c), Education Code, as amended by Chapters 807 (H.B. 22), 842 (H.B. 2223), and 1088 (H.B. 3593), Acts 1-24 1-25 of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, is reenacted and 1-26 1-27 amended to read as follows:

(c) School districts and campuses must be evaluated based on three domains of indicators of achievement adopted under this 1-28 1-29 1-30 section that include:

1-31 (1)in the student achievement domain, indicators of 1-32 student achievement that must include:

1-33 (A) for evaluating the performance of districts 1-34 and campuses generally:

(i) 1-35 an indicator that accounts for the 1-36 results of assessment instruments required under Sections 39.023(a), (c), and (l), as applicable for the district and campus, including the results of assessment instruments required for graduation retaken by a student, aggregated across grade levels by 1-37 1-38 1-39 1-40 subject area, including:

If this 2-65 2-66 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2019. 2-67

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
