- 13 instruction on completing the application for federal student aid
- 14 provided by the United States Department of Education. In
- 15 fulfilling the requirement to provide financial literacy
- 16 instruction under this section, a school district or
- 17 open-enrollment charter school may use an existing state, federal,
- 18 private, or nonprofit program that provides students without charge
- 19 the instruction described under this section.
