FUNDING. (b) The department may accept on behalf of the response team a gift, grant, or donation from any source to carry out the purposes

SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2019, the Department of State Health Services shall establish the border public health response team as required by Subchapter X, Chapter 161, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
