1-25 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-26 AN ACT

1-27 relating to an appropriation of money from the general revenue fund
 1-28 to the State Soil and Water Conservation Board for the purpose of
 1-29 eradicating Carrizo cane, contingent on the receipt of federal
 1-30 funds for the same purpose.

1-31 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-32 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. If the State Soil and Water
 1-33 Conservation Board receives at least \$10 million in federal funds
 1-34 for use during the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2021, for
 1-35 the purpose of eradicating Carrizo cane along the Rio Grande River,
 1-36 then the amount of \$10 million is appropriated from the general
 1-37 revenue fund to the State Soil and Water Conservation Board for the
 1-38 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2021, for the purpose of
 1-39 eradicating Carrizo cane along the Rio Grande River.

1-40 SECTION 2. FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY. The State Soil and Water
 1-41 Conservation Board is required to implement a provision of this Act
 1-42 only if the legislature appropriates money specifically for that
 1-43 purpose. If the legislature does not appropriate money
 1-44 specifically for that purpose, the board may, but is not required
 1-45 to, implement a provision of this Act using other appropriations
 1-46 available for that purpose.

1-47 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September
 1-48 1, 2019.
