SECTION 1. Title 2, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Chapter 60 to read as follows:

PREEMPTION CHAPTER 60.

PREEMPTION OF LOCAL LICENSING REQUIREMENTS. Sec. 60.001. (a) In this section:

(1) "Occupational license" means a license, permit, registration, certificate, or other authorization that is:

(A)

issued by a licensing authority; and required by an ordinance, rule, regulation, (B)

policy, or law for an individual to engage in an occupation.

(2) "Political subdivision" means a municipality, special district, or other political subdivision of this state.

- "State licensing authority" means a state agency, department, board, or commission or the executive or administrative officer of a state agency, department, board, or commission that

- (1) possess an occupational license issued by the political subdivision to engage in that occupation; or
- (2) meet any other requirement or precondition to engage in that occupation.
