A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the creation of the office of criminal district
- 3 attorney of Cooke County, the abolition of the office of county
- 4 attorney in Cooke County, the application of the professional
- 5 prosecutors law to the district attorney for the 235th Judicial
- 6 District, and the compensation of a county auditor in certain
- 7 counties.
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 9 SECTION 1. Section 44.001, Government Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 44.001. ELECTION. The voters of each of the following
- 12 counties elect a criminal district attorney: Anderson, Austin,
- 13 Bastrop, Bexar, Bowie, Brazoria, Caldwell, Calhoun, Cass, Collin,
- 14 Comal, Cooke, Dallas, Deaf Smith, Denton, Eastland, Fannin,
- 15 Galveston, Grayson, Gregg, Harrison, Hays, Hidalgo, Jackson,
- 16 Jasper, Jefferson, Kaufman, Kendall, Lubbock, McLennan, Madison,
- 17 Navarro, Newton, Panola, Polk, Randall, Rockwall, San Jacinto,
- 18 Smith, Tarrant, Taylor, Tyler, Upshur, Van Zandt, Victoria, Walker,
- 19 Waller, Wichita, Wood, and Yoakum.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 44, Government Code, is
- 21 amended by adding Section 44.149 to read as follows:
- Sec. 44.149. COOKE COUNTY. (a) The criminal district
- 23 attorney of Cooke County must be at least 30 years of age and must
- 24 have been a practicing attorney in this state and in Cooke County

- 1 for at least five years. If a person meeting those qualifications
- 2 does not file as a candidate for the office on or before the 30th day
- 3 before the last day on which a person may file as a candidate in an
- 4 election to that office, the qualifications imposed by this
- 5 subsection do not apply to that election only.
- 6 (b) A vacancy in the elected office of criminal district
- 7 attorney is filled by appointment by the Commissioners Court of
- 8 Cooke County. The appointee holds office until the next general
- 9 election.
- 10 (c) The criminal district attorney shall attend each term
- 11 and session of the district courts and the county courts at law in
- 12 Cooke County and each term and session of the inferior courts of
- 13 Cooke County held for the transaction of criminal business and
- 14 shall exclusively represent the state in all criminal matters
- 15 before those courts.
- 16 <u>(d) The criminal district attorney is entitled to receive</u>
- 17 compensation from the state in the amount provided by the General
- 18 Appropriations Act for a district judge.
- 19 (e) The Commissioners Court of Cooke County may supplement
- 20 the salary of the criminal district attorney paid by the state but
- 21 may not pay a supplement to the criminal district attorney that is
- 22 an amount less than the supplement the county pays to the highest
- 23 paid district judge in the county.
- 24 (f) The criminal district attorney shall perform the duties
- 25 <u>conferred by law on county and district attorneys in the various</u>
- 26 counties and districts.
- 27 (g) The criminal district attorney shall collect the fees,

- 1 commissions, and perquisites that are provided by law for similar
- 2 services rendered by a district or county attorney.
- 3 (h) The criminal district attorney, for the purpose of
- 4 conducting the affairs of the criminal district attorney's office,
- 5 may appoint a staff composed of assistant criminal district
- 6 attorneys, investigators, stenographers, clerks, and other
- 7 personnel as the Commissioners Court of Cooke County may authorize.
- 8 The commissioners court shall pay the salaries of the staff in equal
- 9 monthly, biweekly, or weekly installments from the
- 10 officers' salary fund of the county.
- 11 <u>(i) The criminal district attorney:</u>
- 12 (1) shall, with the advice and consent of the
- 13 commissioners court, designate one or more individuals to act as
- 14 <u>assistant criminal district attorney with responsibility for</u>
- 15 assisting the commissioners court; and
- 16 (2) may designate an assistant to represent the
- 17 interests of the state in civil matters in Cooke County.
- 18 (j) The criminal district attorney may, subject to the
- 19 approval of the Commissioners Court of Cooke County, contract with
- 20 attorneys as special assistants to conduct specialized tasks as
- 21 <u>needed.</u>
- SECTION 3. Effective January 1, 2021, Section 46.002,
- 23 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 46.002. PROSECUTORS SUBJECT TO CHAPTER. This chapter
- 25 applies to the state prosecuting attorney, all county prosecutors,
- 26 and the following state prosecutors:
- 27 (1) the district attorneys for Kenedy and Kleberg

- 10 (2) the criminal district attorneys for the counties
- 11 of Anderson, Austin, Bastrop, Bexar, Bowie, Brazoria, Caldwell,
- 12 Calhoun, Cass, Collin, Comal, Cooke, Dallas, Deaf Smith, Denton,
- 13 Eastland, Fannin, Galveston, Grayson, Gregg, Harrison, Hays,
- 14 Hidalgo, Jasper, Jefferson, Kaufman, Kendall, Lubbock, McLennan,
- 15 Madison, Navarro, Newton, Panola, Polk, Randall, Rockwall, San
- 16 Jacinto, Smith, Tarrant, Taylor, Tyler, Upshur, Van Zandt,
- 17 Victoria, Walker, Waller, Wichita, Wood, and Yoakum; and
- 18 (3) the county attorneys performing the duties of
- 19 district attorneys in the counties of Andrews, Aransas, Callahan,
- 20 Cameron, Castro, Colorado, Crosby, Ellis, Falls, Freestone,
- 21 Gonzales, Guadalupe, Lamar, Lamb, Lampasas, Lavaca, Lee,
- 22 Limestone, Marion, Milam, Morris, Ochiltree, Oldham, Orange,
- 23 Rains, Red River, Robertson, Rusk, Swisher, Terry, Webb, and
- 24 Willacy.
- 25 SECTION 4. Section 152.032(d), Local Government Code, is
- 26 amended to read as follows:
- 27 (d) The amount of the compensation and allowances of a

- 1 county auditor in a county subject to this subsection may be set in
- 2 an amount that exceeds the limit established by Subsection (a) if
- 3 the compensation and allowances are approved by the commissioners
- 4 court of the county. This subsection applies only to:
- 5 (1) a county with a population of more than 108,000 and
- 6 less than 110,000;
- 7 (2) a county with a population of 120,000 or more,
- 8 excluding a county subject to Subsection (b);
- 9 (3) a county with a population of more than 1,000 and
- 10 less than 23,000 that borders the Gulf of Mexico;
- 11 (4) a county with a population of more than 11,000 and
- 12 less than 11,650; [and]
- 13 (5) a county that:
- 14 (A) borders a county with a population of more
- 15 than one million; and
- 16 (B) has a population of more than 36,000 and less
- 17 than 40,000; and
- 18 (6) a county with a population of less than 100,000
- 19 that borders Lake Ray Roberts.
- SECTION 5. Effective January 1, 2021, the office of county
- 21 attorney of Cooke County is abolished.
- 22 SECTION 6. Notwithstanding Section 41.010, Government
- 23 Code, the initial vacancy in the office of criminal district
- 24 attorney of Cooke County on creation of the office shall be filled
- 25 by election. The office of criminal district attorney of Cooke
- 26 County exists only for the purposes of the primary and general
- 27 elections in 2020. The qualified voters of the county shall elect

- 1 the initial criminal district attorney of Cooke County at the
- 2 general election in 2020 for a four-year term beginning January 1,
- 3 2021. Thereafter the criminal district attorney of Cooke County
- 4 shall be elected for a four-year term as provided by Section 30,
- 5 Article V, Texas Constitution. A vacancy after the initial vacancy
- 6 is filled as provided by Section 12, Article IV, Texas
- 7 Constitution.
- 8 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect January 1, 2020.
