## 1-17 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to the creation of the Texas Veterans County Service 1-20 Officer Task Force. 1-21 1-22

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 434, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 434.040 to read as follows:

Sec. TEXAS VETERANS COUNTY SERVICE OFFICER TASK 434.040. FORCE. (a) In this section:

"Rural county" means a county with a population of

less than 200,000.
(2) "Task force" means the Texas Veterans County Service Officer Task Force.

"Urban county" means a county with a population of (3)

200,000 or more. The Texas Veterans County Service Officer Task Force is (b) established to study the impact and efficacy of officers in this

state. The task force is composed of the following nine (c)

members:

(1)the chair of the House Committee on Defense and Veterans' Affairs;

(2) the chair of the Senate Committee on Veteran Affairs and Border Security;

a representative of the commission; the chair of the Veterans County Service Officer (4) Advisory Committee;

(5) a representative of the Texas Coalition of

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Veterans Organizations;
(6) an officer representing a rural county selected by the chair of the House Committee on Defense and Veterans' Affairs;

(7) an officer representing an urban county selected by the chair of the House Committee on Defense and Veterans' Affairs;

an officer representing a rural county selected by the chair of the Senate Committee on Veteran Affairs and Border Security; and

(9) an officer representing an urban county selected by the chair of the Senate Committee on Veteran Affairs and Border Security.

(d) of The the House Committee Defense chairs on and Veterans' Affairs and Senate Committee on Veteran Affairs and Border Security serve as co-chairs of the task force.

(e) A recommendation of the task force must be approved by a

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approved by a majority vote of the members of the task force.

(i) This section expires January 1, 2021.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
