 1-18 AN ACT

1-19 relating to the authority of the Kickapoo Traditional Tribe of  
 1-20 Texas to commission peace officers.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. The heading to Article 2.126, Code of Criminal  
 1-23 Procedure, is amended to read as follows:

1-24 Art. 2.126. PEACE OFFICERS COMMISSIONED BY THE  
 1-25 ALABAMA-COUSHATTA [~~INDIAN~~] TRIBE OF TEXAS AND THE KICKAPOO  
 1-26 TRADITIONAL TRIBE OF TEXAS.

1-27 SECTION 2. Article 2.126(a), Code of Criminal Procedure, is  
 1-28 amended to read as follows:

1-29 (a) The tribal council of the Alabama-Coushatta [~~Indian~~]  
 1-30 Tribe of Texas or the tribal council of the Kickapoo Traditional  
 1-31 Tribe of Texas is authorized to employ and commission peace  
 1-32 officers for the purpose of enforcing state law within the  
 1-33 boundaries of the tribe's reservation.

1-34 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
