1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to the Texas Diabetes Council and the state plan for
 1-22 diabetes and obesity treatment and education.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Section 103.001(2), Health and Safety Code, is
 1-25 amended to read as follows:

1-26 (2) "Person with diabetes" means a person diagnosed by
 1-27 a physician in accordance with nationally recognized standards as
 1-28 having diabetes.

1-29 SECTION 2. Sections 103.002(a), (b), and (c), Health and
 1-30 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:

1-31 (a) The Texas Diabetes Council is composed of 11 citizen
 1-32 members appointed from the public and one representative each from
 1-33 the department, the commission, the Employees Retirement System of
 1-34 Texas, the Teacher Retirement System of Texas, and the Texas
 1-35 Workforce Commission vocational rehabilitation services division
 1-36 [Department of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services].

1-37 (b) The governor, with the advice and consent of the senate,
 1-38 shall appoint the following citizen members:

1-39 (1) a licensed physician with a specialization in
 1-40 treating diabetes;

1-41 (2) a registered nurse with a specialization in
 1-42 diabetes education and training;

1-43 (3) a registered and licensed dietitian with a
 1-44 specialization in the diabetes education field;

1-45 (4) a person with experience and training in public
 1-46 health policy;

1-47 (5) three consumer members, with special
 1-48 consideration given to persons active in the Texas affiliates of
 1-49 the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation (JDRF), the American
 1-50 Association of Diabetes Educators, or the American Diabetes
 1-51 Association; and

1-52 (6) four members from the general public with
 1-53 expertise or demonstrated commitment to diabetes issues.

1-54 (c) The commissioner, executive commissioner, executive
 1-55 director of the Employees Retirement System of Texas, executive
 1-56 director of the Teacher Retirement System of Texas, and the
 1-57 director of the Texas Workforce Commission vocational
 1-58 rehabilitation services division ~~commissioner of assistive and~~
 1-59 ~~rehabilitative services~~ shall appoint that agency's
 1-60 representative to the council. Agency representatives shall be

2-1 nonvoting members of the council.

2-2 SECTION 3. Section 103.010, Health and Safety Code, is
2-3 amended to read as follows:

2-4 Sec. 103.010. STAFF AND ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT. (a) Each
2-5 agency represented on the council shall provide the council with
2-6 periodic staff support of specialists as needed and may provide
2-7 staff support to an advisory committee.

2-8 (b) The department shall provide administrative support to
2-9 the council by providing research services and preparing any
2-10 reports required under this chapter.

2-11 SECTION 4. Section 103.011, Health and Safety Code, is
2-12 amended to read as follows:

2-13 Sec. 103.011. ADVISORY COMMITTEES; WORK GROUPS. (a) The
2-14 council may establish advisory committees or work groups that the
2-15 council considers necessary and may determine the appropriate
2-16 membership for each committee or group.

2-17 (b) The council shall specify the purpose and duties of each
2-18 advisory committee or work group and shall specify any product the
2-19 committee is required to develop.

2-20 (c) Members of an advisory committee or work group serve at
2-21 the will of the council. The council may dissolve an advisory
2-22 committee or work group when necessary.

2-23 SECTION 5. Section 103.013, Health and Safety Code, is
2-24 amended by adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:

2-25 (b-1) The state plan may include provisions to address
2-26 obesity treatment, education, and training related to:

- 2-27 (1) obesity-dependent diabetes; and
- 2-28 (2) the health impacts of obesity on a person with
2-29 diabetes.

2-30 SECTION 6. Sections 103.014(a) and (c), Health and Safety
2-31 Code, are amended to read as follows:

2-32 (a) The council shall address contemporary issues affecting
2-33 health promotion services in the state, including:

- 2-34 (1) professional and patient education;
- 2-35 (2) evidence-based [~~successful~~] diabetes
2-36 self-management education strategies;

2-37 (3) evidence-based strategies to achieve the council's
2-38 mission [~~personnel preparation and continuing education~~];

2-39 (4) state expenditures for the prevention, detection,
2-40 management, and treatment of diabetes and obesity [~~chronic~~
2-41 ~~diseases~~]; and

2-42 (5) [~~screening services; and~~
2-43 [~~6~~] public awareness of the specific risks and
2-44 benefits of prevention, detection, management, and treatment of
2-45 diabetes, including obesity-dependent diabetes.

2-46 (c) The council may establish priorities and make
2-47 recommendations for program expenditures that align with the
2-48 council's mission [+

2-49 [~~(1) compile and publish regional directories of~~
2-50 ~~services for persons with diabetes;~~

2-51 [~~(2) design or adapt and publish a handbook in English~~
2-52 ~~and Spanish relating to diet, exercise, and other self-care~~
2-53 ~~management skills for persons with diabetes;~~

2-54 [~~(3) study the feasibility of a statewide hotline for~~
2-55 ~~persons with diabetes; and~~

2-56 [~~(4) study the standards and structure of pilot~~
2-57 ~~programs to provide diabetes education and training in this state].~~

2-58 SECTION 7. Sections 103.017(a) and (c), Health and Safety
2-59 Code, are amended to read as follows:

2-60 (a) The department, commission, and Texas Workforce
2-61 Commission vocational rehabilitation services division [~~Department~~
2-62 ~~of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services~~] shall work with the
2-63 council to jointly develop, produce, and implement a general public
2-64 awareness strategy focusing on diabetes, its complications, and
2-65 techniques for achieving good management. Each agency shall pay
2-66 for the costs of producing and disseminating information on
2-67 diabetes to clients served by that agency.

2-68 (c) The department, commission, and Texas Workforce
2-69 Commission vocational rehabilitation services division [~~Department~~

3-1 ~~of Assistive and Rehabilitative Services]~~ may jointly develop and
3-2 implement a statewide plan for conducting regional training
3-3 sessions for public and private service providers, including
3-4 institutional health care providers, who have routine contact with
3-5 persons with diabetes.

3-6 SECTION 8. Section 103.0175, Health and Safety Code, is
3-7 amended to read as follows:

3-8 Sec. 103.0175. MATERIALS FOR SCHOOL-BASED AND
3-9 SCHOOL-LINKED CLINICS. The council, in consultation with the
3-10 department and the Texas Education Agency, shall develop and make
3-11 available materials that provide information about diabetes to be
3-12 distributed to students and the parents of students by health
3-13 clinics at public primary or secondary schools.

3-14 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
