(c) A government-operated utility shall include with a bill 2-13 2-14 sent to each customer or shall post on the utility's Internet 2**-**15 2**-**16 website:

2-41 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2-42 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 2-43 2-44 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 2-45 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
