 - BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 552, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 552.1315 to read as follows: 1-20 1-21 1-22 1-23

Sec. 552.1315. EXCEPTION: CONFIDENTIALITY OF CERTAIN CRIME VICTIM RECORDS. (a) Information is confidential and excepted from the requirements of Section 552.021 if the information identifies an individual as:

(1) <u>a victim of</u>:

an offense under Section 20A.02, 2 22.021, 43.05, or 43.25, Penal Code; or (A) 20A.03, 1-28 011<u>,</u> 21.02, 21.11 22 an offense that is part of the same criminal (B)

1-29 episode, 1-30 as defined by Section 3.01, Penal Code, as an offense 1-31

described by Paragraph (A); or (2) a victim of any criminal offense, if the victim was younger than 18 years of age when any element of the offense was 1-32 1-33 committed. 1-34

1-35 Notwithstanding Subsection (a), information under this (b) 1-36 section may be disclosed:

(1) to any victim identified by the information, or to or guardian of a victim described by Subsection (a)(2) 1-37 1-38 the parent who is identified by the information; 1-39

(2) to a law enforcement agency for investigative 1-40 1-41 purposes; or

(3) in accordance with a court order requiring the 1-42 1-43 disclosure.

SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to a 1-44 1-45 request for information that is received by a governmental body or an officer for public information on or after the effective date of this Act. A request for information that was received before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the 1-46 1-47 1-48 1-49 date the request was received, and the former law is continued in 1-50 effect for that purpose.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 1-51 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 1-52 1-53 1-54 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 1-55 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

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
