A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-21 relating to next generation 9-1-1 service and the establishment of 1-22 a next generation 9-1-1 service fund. 1-23

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 771.001, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Subdivisions (5-a) and (5-b) and amending 1-24 1-25 Subdivision (6) to read as follows: (5-a) "Next generation 9-1-1 service" has the meaning 1-26 1-27

assigned by 47 U.S.C. Section 942. 1-28

(5-b) "Next generation 9-1-1 service fund" means the 1-29 1-30 9-1-1 service fund established under Section generation next 1-31 771.0713.

1-32 (6) "9-1-1 service" means a communications service 1-33 that connects users to a public safety answering point through a 9-1-1 system. The term includes next generation 9-1-1 service. SECTION 2. Section 771.059, Health and Safety Code, 1-34

1-35 is amended to read as follows: 1-36

Sec. 771.059. <u>TARGET DATE</u> [<u>DEADLINE</u>] FOR STATEWIDE <u>NEXT</u> <u>GENERATION</u> 9-1-1 SERVICE. Before September 1, 2025 [1995], all 1-37 1-38 parts of the state must be covered by next generation 9-1-1 service. 1-39 1-40 SECTION 3. Subchapter D, Chapter 771, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Section 771.0713 to read as follows: Sec. 771.0713. NEXT GENERATION 9-1-1 SERVICE FUND. (a) 1-41

1-42 The next generation 9-1-1 service fund is created as a fund in the state 1-43 1-44 treasury outside the general revenue fund.

(b) Notwithstanding any other law and except as provided by 1-45 federal law, the comptroller shall transfer to the credit of the next generation 9-1-1 service fund any amount available from 1-46 1-47 federal money provided to this state from the Coronavirus State and 1-48 Local Fiscal Recovery Funds under Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2) or from any other 1-49 1-50 federal governmental source for purposes of this chapter. The comptroller shall transfer the money as soon as practicable 1-51 1-52 following the receipt by this state of a sufficient amount 1-53 of 1-54

federal money for the transfer. (c) Money deposited to the credit of the next generation 9-1-1 service fund may be used only for the purpose of supporting the deployment and reliable operation of next generation 9-1-1 1-55 1-56 1-57 1-58 service, including the costs of equipment, operations, and 1-59 administration. Money in the fund may be distributed to only the commission and emergency communication districts and must be used 1-60
