## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

relating to the authority of the Texas Department of Insurance to 1-16 rescind a certificate of compliance issued for an improvement for purposes of coverage through the Texas Windstorm Insurance 1-17 1-18 1-19 Association.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-21 SECTION 1. Section 2210.2515(k), Insurance Code, is amended to read as follows:

1-22 1-23 (k) The department may <u>not</u> rescind a certificate of compliance <u>after issuing the certificate</u> [issued] under this section [if the department finds that the improvement does not comply with the applicable building code under the plan of operation]. [The commissioner may adopt rules as necessary to 1-24 1-25 1-26 1-27 1-28 implement this subsection.]

1-29 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to a certificate of compliance that is in effect or issued on or after 1-30 1-31 the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 1-32 1-33 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 1-34 1-35 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 1-36 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
